

# Plan to make Whenuapai a model urban community



Plans for the urbanisation of Whenuapai as a model for sustainable greenfield development have been approved.

"As our first future urban zone development we have the opportunity to create something special for Auckland and set the tone for the city's growth under our new Unitary Plan rules," said Deputy Mayor Penny Hulse, chair of the Auckland Development Committee.

The Whenuapai Structure Plan sets out how the rural countryside can be turned into a thriving community of 8,000 - 10,000 dwellings and 7,000 jobs over the next five to 20 years.

The structure plan was open to public comment and amended to take account of feedback which highlighted a need to

- protect the natural environment including the sensitive Waitemata Harbour coast
- provide open spaces and recreational areas

 ensure adequate infrastructure including waste water, storm water, schools, community facilities, roading and public transport.

Auckland has an immediate need for housing to rent or purchase at various price levels. Living and working locally with well-connected community facilities and social infrastructure reduces the need for peak-time journeys across the city.

Initiatives which could be explored for Whenuapai include having a range of housing choices, locating homes close to transport, and encouraging quality dwellings that exceed environmental minimums and are usable for people of all ages.

"The area would benefit more from some higher residential densities enabling a community where people can both live and work. This would include a mix of terrace housing and apartments as well as

standalone homes, coupled with a large area of business development," said the deputy mayor.

Whenuapai is also home to the country's largest military airbase and any future development has to ensure that surrounding areas take account of its footprint and operating requirements.

The next step is to prepare a plan change to the Proposed Auckland Unitary Plan Decisions Version to change the current Future Urban Zone to appropriate urban zones.

During the plan change process there will be opportunities for residents and other stakeholders to have their say.

The deputy mayor acknowledged the contribution of elected representatives involved in the development of the plan, Councillors Linda Cooper, Wayne Walker, and John Watson, Local Board members Lisa Whyte, Brenda Steele, Vanessa Neeson, and Independent Maori Statutory Board member Glenn Wilcox.

The full Whenuapai Structure Plan will be available on the council's website next month. A public event to hear more of the process will also be arranged.

# September - Bee Month



The honey bee is in trouble. Worldwide, bee numbers are declining. The bee is being

attacked by an increasing number of bee pests (e.g. varroa mite) and diseases. Featuring prominently in this equation is the severe decline in floral nutrition resources creating a shortage of quality pollen for the bees to eat. Malnutrition severely compromises the bees' resistance to pests and diseases.

We all need to contribute to saving the bees. You can grow any of the following to attract them to your garden.

Annuals: calendula, marigold, sunflowers, poppies, cosmos, hollyhocks, fox gloves, echium, clover, nasturtiums.

Perennials: comfrey, dahlias, echinacea, geraniums, aquilegia, gladiolus, echium blue bedder, Borage, Bergamot, Bee Balm Shrubs: Californian lilac, buddleia, Bees need water!! If you have a bird bath, fill it to a shallow level and place glass pebbles, marbles or small rocks to give the bees something to land on so they can

If you don't have a bird bath, place a couple of dishes near flowering plants with the pebbles and fill regularly. If everyone just does one thing to help we will win!





# **Budget Footnotes**



#### A word of advice about CV's

As we all know there will be changes in our busy lives like changing jobs and these can be very stressful at any time as we all have to upgrade our CV.

I thought I would just give you a few pointers on writing your CV. It is one of the most important "sales tools" that you can use. It tells an employer what level of skills you have achieved and how these skills can be used for this job. Remember that a CV is the first point of contact for your future employer to evaluate you, and getting an interview is a great achievement.

1. Your CV has one role – to get you an interview. So you only need a short summary to say who you are and what skills, experience, training and qualifications you have. There are lots of different ways. Start with a basic format and adapt it to show your skills in the best light. There are two main ways.

#### Here are some guidelines:

- keep it short (1-4 pages)
- put your best skills first
- · use simple language and short sentences
- be positive and enthusiastic
- · don't staple lots of things to it
- make it look good and always type it
- check your spelling and grammar (get someone else to check it too). Don't attach original certificates and references or send them to an employer they could get lost (just take them along in a separate folder when you have an interview). Always take a copy of your CV when you visit an employer.

#### 2. What should my CV say?

- Personal details. Give your full name, and an address and phone number where the employer can contact you. Age and family details are optional.
- Career or personal objective. Say what you want to achieve in your working future. This helps the employer relate your skills to the job.
- Work experience. List the jobs you've had, starting with the most recent and working backwards.
  - Give the job title, the employer's name, the date you started and finished, and a brief description.
- Skills and abilities. List your work-related skills and abilities.
   Some of these might be skills you learnt outside work. So include unpaid, community or family work and say how these skills might suit the job you are applying for.
- Education and training. Including your schooling and other training. Give details of technical and trade certificates, and any study or courses you've done (even if you haven't completed them).
- Other things. Give brief details of your hobbies and interests.
   Include anything else you think is important such as driver's licence or your state of health.
- Referees. Include at least 2 people who can talk about how
  well you've worked in the past. Give their name, position, and
  phone number. But check with them first. Let them know they
  may be contacted and ask what they will say about you.

#### 3. Write a career objective for each job

Try writing a short career objective. It should state your goal and skills that make you suitable, e.g. 'I'm looking for a career, preferably outdoors, where I can develop my skills. I'm hardworking, strong, versatile and in good health.'

#### 4. Issues with work history?

An employer looks at your work history to see if you are suitable. If you don't have specific experience in the job, highlight relevant skills and include your other experience (it doesn't have to be paid work to count).

If you have a gap in your work history, include a short sentence to say what you did and the skills you developed during that time. *Next month, two ways of writing a CV.*





# Council Clips ...

#### Appeals closed on Unitary Plan

Appeals on the Proposed Auckland Unitary Plan closed on Friday 16 September with approximately 100 appeals lodged with the Environment Court and the High Court.

John Duguid, General Manger Plans and Places, says the appeals will affect some parts of the plan, however the council is still working through the appeals to determine exactly what extent they will have on making the plan operative.

"While the Proposed Auckland Unitary Plan rules remain in force, the old rules of the various regional and district plans will also remain in place for those parts of the Proposed Auckland Unitary Plan that are under appeal.

"The majority of appeals lodged are confined to specific details of the plan which are unlikely to impact on its overall implementation.

"However, there are a smaller number of appeals that may have a broader impact.

"Consents will need to be assessed and approved against two sets of rules and decisions will need to be made on a case by case basis on what weight can be given to the Proposed Auckland Unitary Plan.

"It will be a top priority for the council to resolve these appeals and reduce the complexity it has on the consenting process," says Mr Duguid.

All matters under appeal are before the courts, which will determine when appeals will be heard.

## Auckland Council invites applicants for the \$40,000 Love Food Hate Waste Fund

Auckland Council is inviting applications to its first ever Love Food Hate Waste Fund from people with innovative ideas about how to reduce food waste.

The Love Food Hate Waste fund has \$40,000 overall, with maximum funding of \$1,000 per application.

About 40 per cent of what the average household puts out in their rubbish each week is food waste, which goes to landfill. What's more, avoidable food waste costs the average household \$563 a year, with Kiwis spending an estimated \$872 million a year on food that then gets thrown away uneaten.

Waste Solutions General Manager Ian Stupple says no funding application is too small, which makes it ideal for individuals and community groups.

"We're looking forward to seeing a raft of clever ideas on ways to encourage food waste prevention and I would strongly encourage anyone with an interest to apply," he says.

Examples of events that could receive funding include:

- · A community cook-off
- Running a preserves making workshop
- Having a local chef or home cook demonstrate food saving techniques
- · Host a movie screening or discussion group
- Running a Love Food Hate Waste stand at a community event
- Love Food Hate Waste projects in schools
- Food waste reduction initiatives in businesses
- Cooking demonstrations at a community garden

The Auckland local body elections race is on. The gates are open in and the first votes are in.


Between now and midday on Saturday 8 October, over one million eligible voters can cast their ballots to determine the leadership of Auckland for the next three years.



# Whenuapai Floral & Garden Circle

There were 54 members present at the September Meeting at the usual venue of Whenuapai Community Hall. While the number was considerably fewer than normal so too were the names for the Mystery Trip which was consequently cancelled. Members were informed of the Orchid Show September 22-25 and details given of the October Trip to the Kaipara Coast.

Derek from Mega Mitre 10 was our guest speaker and began with some safety tips. When wet, beware of slippery paths. If using bleach to clean them beware of the runoff damaging your plants. Use a tarpaulin to gather weeds rather than a wheelbarrow as much easier to manoeuvre in the wet and won't leave deep wheel tracks in the lawn when you Margaret thanking Derek drag it away.



Clean and sharpen tools ready for the new growing season. Use a fork rather than a spade for digging at this time of year especially. If you have a compost heap, be sure to aerate it by turning it over to avoid a slimy heap. We were reminded of what not to add to our compost by way of food scraps particularly any meat as this encourages vermin. A good time to reduce/eliminate the population of rats and mice from our gardens and there is a variety of baits and traps available for this purpose.

Hydrangeas seem to be making a big come back so I researched a few details which may help produce good specimens of these old favourites. Planting hydrangeas in the right location is extremely important. It can make the difference between growing a lush, lavishly blooming shrub and one that struggles and produces scrawny blooms. All hydrangeas will bloom and grow well in morning sun and afternoon shade. This is especially true of the most commonly grown hydrangeas, the macrophyllas. These are the blue and pink mopheads and lacecaps.

In hot areas Hydrangeas need a lot of water. In fact the word "Hydrangea" comes from the Greek for "water tub". They grow best in rich soil, so dig in compost or other organic matter when you plant them, and mulch well. No hydrangea will do well in heavy shade. You can change the colour of the blossoms by changing the acidity of the soil. Add Aluminium Sulphate to make



the soil acid for Blue flowers or add Lime to make the soil alkaline for Pink flowers. You will need to repeat the process 2 or 3 times over the growing season and continue it as long as you want the change to continue. It may take a year or two to see the results you want.

With raised beds, one can plant about a month ahead of ground beds. Bought compost is already mixed and ready to go onto heavy soil. Use plenty of mulch but not too close to plants. Derek took questions from members and gave helpful informative answers.
