

Our Motorway Opens!



TIP: Tell any first time visitors to take SH18 and get off at Exit 9 (same number going either East or west). That is Brigham Creek Rd Roundabouts

Seven months early, under budget and faster travel times to the Shore and City have arrived; with the opening on 6th August of the new SH18 Motorway to the Shore and SH16 extension towards Kumeu.

Regrettably PM Keys had another commitment opening the Viaduct development so the time for public walking and cyclists all became a little crushed, but thousands enjoyed the occasion and saw first-hand the vast area this now opens up for commercial and residential development between Hobsonville Road and the Motorway.

And where has the traffic gone from Hobsonville Road? Down to around 11% of the past numbers, at last report. Brigham Creek Road traffic numbers are about the same and expected to stay that way for some time.

Two Herald Islanders worked on the project. Dave Cox has to oversee the landscape and plantings for the next couple of years, and my tour of duty as Liaison Manager is about to wrap up.

Watch out for the new pedestrian/cyclist bridge to be built over the motorway behind Westgate (at long last). HEB Construction have recently been awarded the contract, and also expect to take months off the projected build time; so we may have another milestone to open within the year. The pier being built in the middle of the new SH16 extension will remain just a pier for a couple of years it seems; until the Council proceeds with the construction of Northside Drive off Trig Road through to Fred Taylor Drive (was SH16) and the boundary of the new Westgate/Massey Town Centre.

Meanwhile enjoy the new \$220 million motorway. Rated the smoothest drive in New Zealand and it looks great (the orange walls will get better when the plants grow and more artwork is added - we live in hope!) Noel Rugg



Please report even if vehicle is damaged but nothing is taken, and one can always take the car to Henderson Station where they will try to get fingerprints.

An experienced vintner, Shayne was also generous with his knowledge on how to enjoy wines and what to look for in a good drop.

Then it was up to the teams to put that knowledge to practice in the wine and cheese challenge, trying six mystery wines and six mystery cheeses.

Anne's Team from Herald Island had the best nose for both delicacies, followed closely by the Pinot Posse from Waimarie Road.



For those who were wondering what the mystery wines were: Tora Bay Sauvignon Blanc, with grapes from Martinborough; Montana Chardonnay, Gisborne; Saint Clair Pinot Gris, Marlborough; Mill Road Pinot Noir, Hawkes Bay; Corbans White Label Shiraz, (grapes from Adelaide); Selaks Merlot, Hawkes Bay.

It was a fantastic night out, and it was also a great fundraiser towards our latest efforts to refurbish the Whenuapai Hall. Vet's Corner :: :: ::

Cold weather

We have had a number of older dogs coming in with stiff joints since the weather has become significantly colder.

The cold weather often makes the dogs curl up into a ball and stay curled for long periods to remain warm. This tight posture will create tension in some muscles and tendons, creating a stiffening in the joints which often manifests as slow rising and stretching before moving. Usually, as the muscles and tendons ease and warm up, walking becomes easier.

It is important if you have an older dog to ensure they have a comfortable bed out of draughts and up off cold concrete. Also make sure they get up and move about 3-4 times a day.

There are many natural products that you can administer to your dog for stiff joints such as glucosamine and chondroitin, however if stiffness and lameness persists throughout the day it is best to seek a Veterinary opinion to determine the likely level of discomfort. Your Vet will examine and prescribe an appropriate course of anti-inflammatories or other drugs for you pet, if this is indicated.

Remember if you are seeing a significant difference in your pet's mobility with the cold weather please do something for them, I am sure they will love you even more than normal if you do!!



IN 2010 our son Callum was enrolled at Massey High School. He choose to take German as one of his subjects due to the family connection, his Grandad was born and brought up in Berlin.

Mrs Angelika Niall was his German teacher.

Early that year Mrs Niall floated the idea of a school trip to Germany in April 2011, this gave parents and students a vear to save. Six students from Massey High School German classes took up the opportunity.

After discussions at home, it was decided that I accompany the group as a parent helper, and that Callum and I would extend our trip by 10 days to visit some of our fallen family, in war graves through Belgium and France. We would also visit an elderly relative in the UK before flying home.

After much planning and fundraising the trip was on and the rest so they say is history...

TEXT DIARY~

2 April - We are safely in Melborne, great flight.

3 April - Hi Sue and Kad's we are safely in Dubai. We have been in darkness until now. What a long trip. Some sleep, good food.

......

3 April - It is 6.30am Dubai time, not feeling too bad. The terminal is 2km long. The kids are exploring and I am babysitting. I don't need to go shopping.

...... 4 April - Yes, we are here all safe and well. Just had a lovely meal and evening. Stade is very pretty and historic.

...... 5 April - An interesting day tour of school and a guided tour of the town centre. The town is 1200yrs old. Tonight we had a party for the host families. Tonight Callum is very happy. I met Iris his host mother she is very nice. Callum has been fixing bikes. Tonight he was entertaining 4 German boys. Tomorrow we visit Petra's village.

.....

6 April - Hi we have had a great day visiting Buxtehude a neighbouring town and school where Petra comes from. Hamburg tomorrow. Have you JP's mobile number.

6 April - Had a great talk to Klaus (Sue's second cousin). He can't meet up, too busy working. Contacted JP, he is meeting us off the train tomorrow morning.

NB: (JP was a Massey High School Cycling Coach - Callum & Laura are in the Cycling Team. JP continues to have dealing with the school and sends cycling emails from Germany. Sue organised for us to meet him while we were in Hamburg).

7 April - Weather was grey, but not raining. Shirt under jacket. Playing golf with Jakob, Heinrich and Anna. Later green cheese tonight. Two varieties with ash in it I think. The children liked their gifts. Jakob wore the hat to school today. Amazing architecture and model railway. Bus to Bremerhaven tomorrow. I have sore calf mussels from the miles of walking but good otherwise. Am going to get something for Kads birthday here in Stade on Friday.

..... 7 April - JP was a very nice person, spent over 2hrs with us in the city. Has a German wife. Easier to live in Germany.

....... 8 April - Went to Bremerhaven today. Fine with cold wind. Have a small present to sort for Kad tomorrow for her birthday. Have you seen Facebook today. (German trip photos on a Facebook page to keep families in touch).

A fantastic history lesson ~ German language trip 2011 by Inver McElroy

On April 2nd, 12 students from Massey High School and Rutherford College travelled to Germany accompanied by two teachers, a brother and a parent (me). We landed in Hamburg 29 hours after leaving Auckland and were taken by our hosts to their homes in and around the town of Stade. This town dates back 1200 years and has been kept very original. A new house looks 300 years old although houses outside the old part are more contemporary. I was lucky enough to stay in the old town and I had a leisurely 5 minute stroll to school with my host Heinrich, the English teacher at the Vincent-Lubeck-Gymnasium (the local school). On our way we passed over, what was the city moat still full of water; the city wall has long since gone. Our students met at school each day, had lessons with their hosts and then we went on tours, the first day a tour of Stade, the following day we had trips to Hamburg. Bremerhaven and the neighbouring town of Buxtehude. Buxtehude is where Petra, the teacher from Rutherford

College grew up and went to school. It has two claims to fame, the first is that a children's story 'The Hare and the Hedgehog' (English version of 'The Hare and the Tortoise') originated. The second point of interest was the English saying 'going to Timbuktoo' the German say 'going to Buxtehude'.

After a wonderful, busy and social week we took the ICE train (Inter City Express) to Berlin. Nothing like our trains, we cruised at 230km/h which felt like we were only going 50km/h! The country side was interesting very flat, no fences around the fields as all the stock are housed inside, and wild deer everywhere. As we approached Berlin and crossed into the old East, the buildings changed in style with many being the slab sided concrete monstrosities.

We arrived at the main station in Berlin and were again met by our hosts this time from the Luise-Henriette-

Schule Gymnasium (school). The Massey High teacher Angelica was a student there. My host Christine was also an English Teacher and she gave me a tour around Tempolhof which has the old Berlin airport where the Berlin Airlift took place in 1948. West Berlin at that time had been completely shut off by the Russians, no food water or power. Volunteer pilots (mostly American) flew

over airspace commonly known as 'The Airbridge' and dropped off supplies to the people, everything even a coal fired power station. A plane landed every two minutes, and they kept it up for a whole year! An amazing feat. The kids called the plans 'Raisin Bombers' because they dropped raisins and lollies for the children. My father-in-law was one of the children waiting on the air field.

On the Saturday night and Sunday I was fortunate enough to have a tour around the centre of Berlin with our teachers and their hosts who were very knowledgable on the history of Berlin. You could spend weeks wandering around this central city area much of which has been restored since WWII.

During the week the group visited historical sites including Check Point Charlie and the Television Tower, visited magnificent Department Stores and became adept at catching the trains and buses. We all met up at the school daily and most days I rode the 8kms on a bicycle, a really nice ride alongside canals and through

parks. Bicycles are a problem in Berlin because there are too many of them! But they certainly are a great way to get around. Most of the northern part of Germany is flat and there are bicycle paths all over the country making it safe and easy to ride.

After another busy week we again boarded an ICE train, this time down to Munich.



Physio speaks ...

Shin Splints

'Medial Tibial Stress Syndrome' more commonly known as Shin Splints defines the condition in which stress, over time, causes injury to the medial (inside) part of the tibia (lower leg). It is very common with high impact athletes - runners, netball, basketball,

What causes Shin Splints?

The pain associated with shin splints is thought to correspond to the area where the soleus muscle of the calf attaches to the lower, inner shin bone. Repeated unaccustomed loading of the muscle attachment to the bone can cause an inflammatory response. This in turn can lead to breakdown of tissue with a spectrum of injury which sometimes can lead ultimately to stress fracture.

What are the Symptoms?

Pain located on the medial (inside) part of the lower leg

Pain initially on running which may ease during early phases but deteriorates with late phase

Pain may be related to training on exceptionally hard surfaces Pain may linger after cessation of the offending activity May be associated with tight calf muscles

What are the underlying causes?

Typically this is an overuse injury but there are some common underlying causes:

Training load - Too much too soon/hard surfaces

Poor biomechanics/running technique/muscle balance issues Poor calf flexability

Poor shoe condition or incorrect shoe selection

How is this managed?

Most important is identifying which factors are contributing to the underlying cause. It may be necessary to reduce the training load or cross train to allow healing of tissues. Physiotherapy management may include:

Soft tissue manipulation / massage

Muscle balance exercises

Acupuncture

Proprioceptive taping

MMP, are you for it or against it?

In previous months we gave an overview of the forthcoming referendum on MMP introduced by Justice Minister Simon Power and provided details of the options which electors will have to choose from. We then explained what will happen next depending on the result of the referendum, and this month we will give you information on other related matters.

Do not leave it until the last minute to get an understanding of what this will mean to you and your community. A bad choice now could effect you and your community for many years to come.

How will the public be informed of the alternative voting systems?

The Electoral Commission will undertake a public information campaign to inform voters about the referendum, the alternative voting systems, and the provision for a review of MMP. This campaign will provide information about the referendum and the details of the alternative voting systems. The campaign will aim to present information as simply as possible for voters to have a good understanding about the referendum and the options. It is intended that this campaign will stimulate public debate and raise awareness about the referendum.

How will the referendum be administered?

The bill provides that the referendum will be administered by the Electoral Commission in accordance with rules set out in the empowering legislation. These rules include technical provisions about, for example, who can vote, how they can vote, the role of election officials, and how the vote is counted and officially reported.

Are there any rules around advertising for or against any of the referendum options?

The bill provides that anyone advertising for or against any of the referendum options will need to include their name and address on the advertisement (a promoter statement).

If the promoter of a referendum advertisement spends more than \$12,000 during the regulated period, the promoter will need to register with the Electoral Commission. The commission will publish a list of registered promoters. Referendum promoters will also be subject to expenditure limits. Each referendum promoter will be able to spend up to \$300,000 in the regulated period.

A registered promoter who spends more than \$100,000 during the regulated period will also be required to provide returns of their expenses to the commission. Promoters will not be required to provide returns of their funding sources to the commission.

This goes further than the advertising rules in place for the 1992, 1993 and 1997 referenda, where there was no expenditure limit and no need to register with the Electoral Commission. All that was needed was a promoter statement.

What about changing the size of the House, the Mâori seats or the fixed South Island seats?

For the purposes of the 2011 referendum, three aspects of New Zealand's electoral system will remain the same in the descriptions of each of the voting systems. The referendum is not proposing any voting systems that change the size of the House or the provisions relating to the Mâori seats and the fixed number of seats for the South Island:

The size of the House will be at least 120 members.


There will be no change to the basis for determining the number of the Mâori seats. The number of Mâori seats is based on the number of Mâori voters on the Mâori electoral roll.

Nestled in the picturesque Henderson Valley is a boutique winery called Corazon Wines. Corazon (Kor-A-Zon) is Spanish for the Heart. A name chosen by Winemaker and Owner Shayne Cox to reflect his passion for wine, he came up with the name while making wine in Chile.

Shayne is a long term resident of West Auckland, starting his winemaking career on vineyards in Whenuapai 20 years ago. That time, tractor driving and grape picking has lead to an extensive winemaking journey working both nationally and internationally, managing projects in France, Italy, and Chile as well as for some of NZ's leading wine companies.

Shayne established Corazon Wines in 2002 and has built the annual production to 2000 cases

under the 'Single Vineyard' label using fruit sourced from premium vineyard sites around NZ.

"New Zealand should be proud of our wines and the progress we have made as an industry' says Shayne "Kiwi's are a clever bunch and I have learned a great deal here, but my experiences in Europe have also play a great part in the style of wines I make" Stylistically Shayne looks for complexity, harmony and elegance



in the wines. He aims to produce wines that partner well with food and have a sense of place at the table.

Most of fruit received is hand harvest, batch fermented and released as single vineyard offerings.

Key varietals in the range are Sauvignon Blanc, Chardonnay, Pinot Gris, Rose and Syrah. With a production of only 150-400 cases per wine the volumes are quite limited. All of the wines are available for tasting at the winery tasting room and winery tours are also available by appointment.

Corazon has also been regularly approached to do contract winemaking for local vineyards. "We deal with 10 varietals in total and have managed to achieve some excellent awards for

our clients and ourselves over the years." Says Shayne "It's a fascinating and very busy job, people often have little idea of the work and skill that goes into a glass of good wine."

To help explain the winemaking process Shayne and Kumeu resident Ben Naden have produced an entertaining one hour documentary called "Passion and Patience, a Wine Story" It shows the entire winemaking process from go to whoa. It has already received excellent reviews from some of NZ's leading wine writers and is recommended viewing for any wine enthusiast.

The following Saturday I took Maggie to her boutique and left her (somewhat dismayed!!) to Keillie to do what needed to be done.







From hairdresser to commercial gerbera grower that was the leap that Justine Miller and her family made in 2008 when they bought a property in Waimauku. The original plan was to look for somewhere to set up a Bed and Breakfast. Instead they went for an established gerbera growing business. The place looked fine and seemed a good business venture but after the sale went through the owners gave up looking after the plants and by the time Justine took possession the plants were in such a state that

they had to throw them all out and start from scratch. It was hard work but with the help

and advice from fellow growers they increased the plastic houses from 600sqm. to double that. They sprayed to get rid of any pests and bugs and installed an imported a growing system called Wormlatham. It's all computerised to help get the best growing conditions in the houses. 18-25 degrees are ideal but in summer it can get up to 35 degrees. The best growing medium is coco peat and pumice; they don't like wet feet, the soil should be dryish. Nutrients are essential for good blooms and colour. An interesting fact - the colour can be affected by the nutrients fed to the plants. Also they need more feeding in summer. Gerberas originally come from South Africa. Today Holland is the biggest grower.

At present they have 6,500 plants, and grow 30 different varieties in all colours. The most popular colours are pink, red and yellow. They grow the standard gerberas which need to be wired to stop the flowerhead from flopping over and minis, which are about half the size. Flowers can vary from a simple daisy shape to ones with wider, thicker petals, or double petals, giving a fluffy look to the flower. The plants are grown from tissue and a small plant will take six weeks to mature and produce blooms. Usually a plant will keep on producing flowers, about eight per plant. Gerbera plants can last for up to five or six years if they are well cared for.

Being a small family business their gerberas don't go to a market but are sold directly to a list of clients. Justine said with hindsight she would cut down on the number of different varieties grown as sometime it is difficult to fulfil orders.



Gerberas are susceptible to powdery mildew, botryose, white fly, thrips, spider mite and leaf roller fortunately not all at the same time. They cope with any pest by intensive spraying. And keep a log on what works best for different bug problems.

Some varieties grown are Don Juan, Mont Blanc, and Monet to name a few.

They can be grown indoors as well as outdoors, but they need a sheltered warm sunny spot. If grown in pots they can be moved close to a wall for shelter and heat. Gerberas as cut flowers do not need a lot of water as this rots them and it should be changed regularly.

Justine gave a great insight on how to succeed in a totally new business field, with no experience. It has been quite a challenging learning curve with lots of trial and error but thing are now coming right.

Next month sees our celebrity speaker of the year Xanthe White. She will talk about her experiences at the latest Chelsea Flower Show. 


