

Innovative Whenuapai GP makes visits stress-free

Fifteen years ago, Peter bought a piece of land in Home Place, Albany, with the vision of creating a medical centre that felt "unmedical" and stress-free.

The result is Northcare Accident & Medical - a state-of-the art medical centre off Constellation Drive filled with light, soft music and artwork; which smells more of coffee and fresh baking, than medical chemicals.

The centre, created after years of research, observation and planning, was officially opened last month by the Minister of Health, Jonathan Coleman.

Whenuapai resident Dr Peter Boot is North Shore GP, running the Albany Basin Accident and Medical Centre, Peter knew doctors' rooms and medical centres could be intimidating for anxious patients and young children.

> His dream was to create a family-friendly centre which offered an impressive range of medical services, GPs, nurses and specialists under one roof.

> The new seven-day Northcare centre offers doctors, urgent care and emergency facilities; high-tech imaging and x-rays; physiotherapists, dentists, laboratory collection, and hand specialists; ear, nose and throat and audiology professionals; the Skin Institute clinic; and other specialists including renal, respiratory and sleep, spinal and orthopaedic services.

> Incorporated in Northcare's spacious, airy foyer is Remedy Café and a seven-day pharmacy. Patients' prescriptions can be sent electronically to the pharmacist who will have received them by the time consultations are over.

> Peter has been involved in every detail of Northcare's design, with the help of an old canoeing friend, architect Allan Shanahan. The centre is a three-level, 1650sqm modernist building - a combination of edgy industrial design and cedar panels for a more homely feel.

> Inside, anilluminated "forest" of birds and trees, that change colour, lights up the fover. with other pieces of art displayed on walls.

> Now that the centre is open, Peter will focus on new innovations to make patients' lives easier. Patients can already book online, but next will be the ability to log personal and medical details remotely - from a mobile phone while riding on a bus or train - so there will be no need for form-filling at the clinic.

Whenuapai school and PTA are hosting a twilight car boot sale and carols by candle community event to help raise funds for our growing school.



Chairman's Report ~ Whenuapai Village Ratepayers and **Residents Association AGM 2017**

In the last 12 months we have seen dramatic evidence of change in the area, with local residents and R&R members liaising with council planners and doing their best to keep progress in the area as beneficial as possible in today's Auckland.

Our village hall is continuing to be a great benefit to the community allowing local groups to meet, learn and socialize. This is a very important asset in the midst of urban development. Usage of the hall has grown well this year and we often receive positive feedback from the many groups that use the hall.

We have a very nice, large Totara tree next to the hall, whose roots unfortunately discovered our hall's historic septic system. As of November last year we have had to have regular pumpouts of the septic tank to keep the hall operating.

It has been a long slog dealing with various departments of the council to get a new system in place and though a suitable new system has been found and chosen by the R&R. we are once again waiting for various council approvals. Reluctantly we have had to decline large group bookings when possible.

Fortunately after a great effort by the R&R, we received a grant from the Upper Harbour Local Board that was more than we were told to expect. This, combined with existing cash reserves, should cover the cost of a new system. But the tree probably won't grow as fast as it has done, and some hall maintenance may be delayed until more funding is found.

This year has seen the start of the Whenuapai Restoration Group, started by local resident Paul Herbert. Already the members have improved the landscape near the Waimarie Rd boat ramp and provided another focus and opportunity for local residents to make a positive difference.

Paul has also found himself leading pest eradication in the village. I suspect major property developers are not included in the list.

We also have a herb group that is planning to develop some beds in the area next to the hall, an addition many will welcome I'm sure. We wish them well.

The changes in the area have at least answered one question that has befuddled mankind for years. "Why did the chicken cross the road?" It wanted to avoid the earthmoving machinery.

Personally I'd like to thank all the members of the R&R for their wonderful selfless effort this year, the volunteer work that goes on largely unnoticed to support the community and the hall would surprise many residentswell done and thank

Kowhai Beach Bushcare Day Saturday 2nd September 2017

Wind, waves and weeds, conifers and claymakethe shoreline and cliffs of Kowhai Beach Reserve harsh environment for regenerating native bush, leading to considerable plant losses since its first planting four years ago.

To protect these vulnerable areas and enhance the North-West Wildlink, volunteers scaled clay banks and sloping ground to densely plant 400 more local native plants. This planting day, a Kaipatiki Bushcare Day, was organised by Kaipatiki Project;

who provided locally sourced plants grown in their nursery, planting guidance, trainee helpers and a barbecue and stir fry for the 28 hard-working volunteers. The Upper Harbour Local Board Herald Island Environmental Group(HIEG) to add another layer to its restoration work at Kowhai Beach Reserve.



Prior to the planting day, the HIEG weeding group had a number of weeding sessions at the reserve and on the planting day, volunteers pulled out the many Wattles and thousands of Sweet Pea shrubs, which had begun to invade the reserve. Although some areas needed more care and attention. others were flourishing. The reserve steps were a lush tunnel of lacy ferns and greenery, Kumeraho was in full golden bloom and a Kowhai planted in 2013 displayed its first flowers.

From our perspective, it was a very successful day and we were very thankful that the rain died down before we started planting!

Many thanks to the Upper Harbour Local Board for funding the generously funded the day. This was a great opportunity for the day, Derek Craig of Kaipatiki Project for growing the plants, organising and running the day, the HIEG weeding group (Sue Larmer, Linda Lewis and Anne Johnson) for helping weed the reserve, Charissa Snijders for pulling out thousands of Sweet Pea shrubs, Anna Baine Community Ranger for organising weed removal, Auckland Council contractor Ventia for removing the weeds, John Diprose of Harcourts Cooper & Co. for providing flyers and weed-eating reserve grass, Ian McNeill for Facebook promotion, Sue McElroy for poster advertising, the Kaipatiki Project trainees for moving plants and providing refreshments, Ian McNeill and Christine Johnston for manning the barbecue and all the volunteers who clambered over clay banks and climbed slopes to get the plants in the ground.

Get your own Criminal Record

If you have a criminal record, you can easily get a copy of it. Why would you want it? In many cases, convictions relating to certain crimes and sentences received are NOT shown on your record under the Criminal Records (Clean Slate) Act 2004. In this case, if you are asked about convictions, you do not need to disclose them.

There are some job roles, where you may have to provide details - e.g. Police or security roles. It is useful to have your record so that you know dates and details, if you need them, for employment or travel purposes. Note that convictions hidden under the Clean Slate scheme are still shown for visa applications for some countries.

It is easy to get your own criminal record; you just need to fill in the form and submit it with the required personal ID.



September at Palmers


It's the month we long for all winter, when spring is sprung! There's lots of new life and colour emerging, the gorgeous pink blossom of the cherry trees intoxicating the Tui, brightly coloured daffodils and tulips, magnolias blooming, such promise of sunnier times ahead!

September is also the start of Bee Aware Month, Apiculture NZ's annual awareness drive to raise the profile of the honey bee in New Zealand. Bees are vitally important in the garden and in our food production, and their communal wellbeing is paramount.

You can help ensure bees stay happy and healthy by planting lots of nectar and food sources for them - they especially love blue, purple and yellow flowers! Single flowers (those with one ring of petals) provide more nectar and pollen than double flowers, in which extra petals have replaced pollen-laden anthers. Flat or shallow blossoms, such as daisies, zinnias and asters will attract the largest variety of bees. Long-tongued bees will be attracted to plants in the mint family, such as salvia, oregano, mint and lavender.

Strawberries also need to be planted now so you can be enjoying their delicious fruit by Christmas - we recommend at least 5 plants per person in your home to ensure there is enough to go around!

New rubbish service on the way

A new Council wheelie bin service for rubbish will be rolling out across urban areas of the Albany Ward shortly.

Residents currently using pre-paid orange rubbish bags will move to a wheelie bin service. Residents are urged to get out their old blue and yellow recycling bins and put them back into use for this service.

Western areas (west of the Greenhithe bridge), including Hobsonville, Herald Island and Whenuapai, will go first starting in October 2017.

North Shore urban areas, including Albany, Rosedale, Greenhithe and Schnapper Rock, Northcross, Browns Bay, Mairangi Bay and Campbells Bay will start in March 2018.

No changes have been confirmed yet for rural areas of the ward, including Albany Heights, Lucas Heights, Paremoremo and areas north of Okura on the Hibiscus Coast.

To use the service, residents simply purchase a pre-paid tag and attach it to the handle of their bin. The new bin tags will be available at the same places you buy bags and collection days remain the same.

Auckland Transport has just announced that funding has been approved for three new road projects in Albany.

Anew link road between Gills Road and Oteha Valley Road, a new link road between Medallion Drive and Fairview Avenue and an upgrade of the Dairy Flat Highway between Stevenson Crescent and Gills Road. The Dairy Flat Highway intersection with The Avenue and Lucas Creek Bridge will also be upgraded.

The investigation of designs and statutory requirements for each of these projects will begin shortly. Subject to land acquisition and statutory approvals, physical construction will start for the link road between Gills Road and Oteha Valley Road in October 2018. Work on the link road between Medallion Drive and Fairview Avenue and the Dairy Flat Highway upgrade will commence in early 2019.

These improvements will not only improve the travel time reliability for current residents, but also unlock the development potential that exists along our rural urban boundary.

Performance boost for QBE stadium

The recent upgrade of QBE Stadium's outer oval has boosted the venue's ability to host high-performance and community sports activity throughout the year.

Previously, the outer oval could support 630 hours of sports activity a year. The new facilities can support more than 2500 hours of training and high-performance activity so it's a real boost for rugby, AFL and soccer, and will free up time for community sport.

The \$2.5 million project includes earthworks, installation of the hybrid turf and LED floodlights and the development of a new groundskeepers' compound.

The work is part of Regional Facilities Auckland's Venue Development Strategy, which is intended to transform Auckland's network of stadiums.

Housing and Home Loan News for September 2017

Quiet Housing Market Focuses On Election

- The Reserve Bank has forecast an unchanged Official Cash Rate through all of 2017 and all of 2018. It does not see the first hike until late 2019.
- Banks have stopped lifting longer term mortgage rates and now also see the OCR on hold until late 2018 after weak inflation and growth figures.
- The Reserve Bank is unlikely to be able to introduce a DTI limit in 2017. It has to do lengthy consultation and it has said it would not use the tool right now even if it had it because of the market's moderation.

Mortgage borrowing strategy:

Average mortgage rates remained virtually unchanged again this month, and retain the by-now very familiar tick-shape. The 1 year rate remains the low point; and against our expectation of the next OCR hike being delayed till November 2018, it remains the "sweet spot". It is not quite the proxy for floating that the 6 month could be considered to be, but it's a lot cheaper and fixing annually is still fairly regularly. Longer-term rates remain very low by historic standards and offer certainty, but they are financially less attractive

in this low inflation environment







Projects underway at the Hobsonville Herb Group

Diane Griffin, our convenor, drives the Hobsonville Herb Group with great energy and enthusiasm. The group meets monthly to learn about herbs, make natural remedies and explore and share ideas. We also have a supper and catchup at the end of the evening. Our numbers were down tonight with only 12 members attending the September meeting, but for those who attended, we enjoyed an interesting night learning about Chamomile and making natural toothpaste, see the recipe below:

Baking Soda Toothpaste

6tsp Baking Soda

1/2tsp Salt

1 drop Essential Oil (eg: Peppermint, Orange, Vanilla,

Cinnamon, Clove or Wintergreen)

NB: Cinnamon or Clove oil may irritate sensitive gums or

tongue in some people.

1tsp Glycerine

1/2tsp Ground Ginger (for flavour and to fight bacteria if

desired).

1tsp Water to mix to a paste consistency.

Combine the baking soda and salt in a bowl, mix with water and glycerine until a smooth, thick paste forms. Add essential oil and stir. Pour into a lidded container and store up to 1 month. To use, dip your toothbrush into the paste and brush as normal.

Our herb of interest for September was 'Chamomile', it has a long history as a healing herb, and is used as a calming tea among others things. Chamomile is known by many different names, it is an annual and can be grown from seed.

Here's a couple of tips we picked up while chatting at supper - Putting citrus oil (or citrus wax cubes) in a burner helps keep flies out of the house. Apparently flies don't like citrus. Here's another... Crushed 'Rue' rubbed on furniture stops cats from scratching the furniture and crushed strawberries rubbed on your teeth takes the brown stains away, who would have guessed.

October is going to be a busy month, our herb of interest will be 'Borage'. We'll have Minette from

Meadowsweet Herbs & Flowers visit the group, she'll be bringing along some of her herb plants for sale. We'll also be sharing our handmade, natural cleaning products. Diane gave us each a sheet, we were asked to choose one recipe, make it up, try using it and bring it along and share our findings. Then the major project, some of you may have read about the proposed 'Community Herb Garden' in the *NorWest News*. The garden is to be installed in the Malcolm Hahn Reserve by the Whenuapai Village Hall. The Council are onboard, and the Upper Harbour Local Board have approved a grant of \$600 for the project. Diane is contacting some of the major seed companies now, to organise a supply of herb seeds.

The initial working bee will take place on Sunday 15 October, members of the Hobsonville Herb Group will be out with their spades, preparing the area for planting. If you're interested in the Herb Garden Project, please feel free to come along and give us a hand. The garden will run along the boundary of the Malcolm Hahn Reserve and be edged with ponga logs. Members of the herb group plan to grow the herbs from seed and plant them out as seedlings when the weather warms up. It will be an ongoing project, and eventually, we hope, a thriving herb garden will be available for community use.

The Hobsonville Herb Group meets at 7.15pm, on the second Tuesday of the month, at the Whenuapai Village Hall, Waimarie Road, Whenuapai. All welcome, \$5 per night to cover evening projects. There's always a trading table, raffles and an extensive library for members.

Herald Island

Minette Toloni returned again this year, this time to speak about Edible Flowers. Once again she presented a very helpful and informative power point and brought freshly picked examples to identify and taste. Here are some of the ideas she shared with us. Try either as whole flowers (nasturtiums, borage) or simply just petals (calendular, dandelion) fresh in salads. Use as a garnish on a serving plate (gladiolus, impatiens, fushia) or an edible decoration on top of a cake (violets, pansies, roses, carnations, chrysanthemum) Float in a punch bowl (sunflowers, citrus) or even in ice cubes (basil, mint) in a jug of water. Also use in cooking biscuits (lavender, rosemary) or savory dishes (sage, radish, oregano) pickles (chives, chicory) or steep in boiling water to make a tea(camomile, jasmine, hibiscus, lemon verbena) Of course don't forget flowers stuffed with a savory or rice filling (zucchini, squash) can be lightly fried as an appetizer. And the list goes on....

Be careful to stay safe, by making sure you can identify the flowers correctly. Choose organic flowers from your own garden, the ones you know haven't been sprayed and avoid roadside flowers covered in pesticides and florist or nursery flowers treated with chemicals. Minette brought us seedlings that she sells at markets, under her business name of *Meadowsweet Herbs*. She certainly motivated everyone to try something new!


