



It seems I'm not the only one who disagrees with Noel Rugg's assertion that traffic flow on Brigham Creek Road remains unchanged since the Hobsonville Motorway opened. A number of people have affirmed my observation that, since the motorway opened, one invariably has to wait for a break in the traffic when exiting Totara Road on to Brigham Creek Road. Some have noted that having a quiet coffee at Lombardi's is now a thing of the past. While the quality of the coffee is as good as ever, it is now virtually impossible to hold a conversation without straining to hear or be heard because of the noise of the constant flow of traffic. One ex-resident who still regularly frequents Lombardi's particularly noted the increase in heavy traffic. Brigham Creek Road was never constructed as a main thoroughfare designed to take the volume of traffic it now carries. I predict that it will require vast sums of money to upgrade Brigham Creek Road in the future, money that would be well spent designing and constructing an interchange that will connect the Kumeu motorway extension with the Hobsonville motorway.







It captures the still waters of the area just seconds before sunrise. Still a great neighbourhood

After more than 27 years I still think the Village is a great place in which to live. I've always maintained that as long as we have to live in Auckland, this is the place to be. Even when I retire, until my wife and I can find a quiet little paradise, I expect this is where we'll stay. On a scale of 1 to 10 I would give it somewhere between 7 and 8, which implies that it's not perfect and there is room for improvement.

Whenever I write to the *Causeway*, or on those rare occasions when my letters make it to the *Herald*, my neighbour light heartedly ribs me about "Discontented of Whenuapai having his say again". The fact is, when I do bleat on about things that aren't quite right it's usually the result of consultation with others. In other words the views I air aren't necessarily always just my own. More often than not I burst into print after I discover that others share my views.

So, what is there that detracts from making our neighbourhood perfect?

First is dogs, especially those that seem to be trained to let the whole neighbourhood know that either a) someone or, heaven forbid, another dog is passing their property or b) they are home alone and pine for a bit of company. The latter is probably most vexing because the owners won't be aware what a nuisance their beloved pet is because they aren't home to witness its endless yapping.

Second is open rubbish fires. Quite apart from the offensive stench the smoke creates and that infiltrates washing on the line, many new and renovated homes have a ventilation system installed. This sucks in air either from the roof cavity or from outside. So it doesn't take much to figure that it takes very little time for the smoky smell to be pumped right throughout the house. I can say from experience it is not nice.

The now completed pathway along Totara Road is great and is well utilised by pedestrians, joggers and cyclists alike. However there can be a problem there in the form of vehicles that park across the path. On a recent weekend walk along the path we encountered no less than three cars blocking our way. I can also youch for an employee at the Air Force Base who was cycling to work one morning only to find his way blocked by a large black 4WD straddling the path. No, not parked across it but along it with wheels either side of the path. Said cyclist had no option but to exit the path to be met by a large Ritchies bus coming around the corner. In his haste to get back on the path the cyclist lost traction between the road and the path, fell in the mud and landed heavily on his shoulder on the path. After a visit to his doctor, three X-Rays, an ultra-sonic scan and finally an MRI scan the victim is now awaiting surgery to repair the damage he suffered. Unless they read this article I expect the owner of the vehicle will remain oblivious of the effects of their ill considered actions.

All in all, our neighbourhood is still better than most by a long shot. With Lombardi's, Baba's and The Brigham we have eating establishments that rank with the best, the neighbours are friendly and our respective R&R committees do a great job organizing entertainment and fostering community spirit. We just need to eliminate the little thoughtless acts to bring us a notch or two closer to 10 out of 10.





Vet's Corner :: :: ::

FIREWORKS 2011

It seems that the fireworks displays have become larger and louder and much more spectacular than years gone by.

This is great for those who love to watch the displays, but for those of us that have pets that fear loud noises it can be devastating for the pets.

If you have a pet that develops signs of noise anxiety, such as cowering, hiding and seeking out company, you need to consider a few simple steps that can make the stressful episode more tolerable.

It is best to settle your pet inside before an anticipated noisy event.

Close the curtains, put the TV on louder than usual but not too loud. Create a cosy confined space for your pet so that they can bunker down and feel secure. Do not pander to them too much as you will be rewarding the behaviour and this can make the situation worse. Just a few reassuring words now and again will usually suffice.

In cases of severe anxiety you may need to have anti anxiety medication prescribed by your Veterinarian, as well as DAP diffuser (Dog Appeasing Pheromone) plugged into a wall socket to control the stress related symptoms.

It would be nice if Guy Fawkes occurred on one or two nights of the year not starting a week before and dragging on for a week afterwards.

Physio speaks ...

Patello-Femoral Knee pain

This refers to pain around the front of the knee cap and is often associated with running activities, squatting or going down stairs. The pain can be sharp and usually associated with activity following periods of inactivity.



What causes it?

The patella is a floating bone situated

inside the quadriceps tendon. It glides through the groove on the lower part of the thigh bone or femur. If the patella tracks outside this groove, it can potentially irritate the tissue underneath. There are many factors that can cause this:

- Weak hip rotators or quadriceps muscles
- Poor foot biomechanics
- Excessive tightness around the hip/knee
- Poor running technique

How should this be managed?

To prevent further damage and irritation, avoidance of the aggravating activities is important. Treatment will focus on settling the pathology but most important to long term relief is identifying the underlying causative factors.

Physio Management

Treatment focuses on settling the irritated tissue. Techniques utilised may include Acupuncture, Massage, Stretching, taping or other electrotherapy modalities

Next on the hall renovation agenda are new drapes, repolishing the beautiful native timber floors and repainting the exterior.


