500 new homes in the Airfields precinct at Hobsonville Point



Stage Two development area

Panuku Development Auckland has confirmed Avanda Group as the housing developer for Stage Two of the Airfields precinct at Hobsonville Point.

The Airfields precinct is a 20 hectare Council-owned site, which was formerly part of the Hobsonville Airforce Base.

Avanda and its building partners will develop more than 500 homes in Stage Two, of which a minimum of 10 per cent will be affordable housing. Housing will be delivered within an agreed timeframe.

Panuku Chief Executive Roger MacDonald says Avanda was chosen after a competitive tender process was undertaken, with strong interest received from six potential developers.

"Avanda is a significant new entrant in the property development market and they showed commitment to developing all of Stage Two, rather than just individual parcels that were offered to the market."


Avanda has commenced detailed design to obtain the necessary resource consents for infrastructure works so that housing can be developed.

"We look forward to working with Avanda as they bring our masterplan for hundreds more quality homes in Airfields at Hobsonville Point to fruition to help ease Auckland's housing shortage," says Mr MacDonald.

Avanda project manager Winson Tan says Avanda is delighted to be working with Panuku to realise the potential of the Airfields precinct and proud to be building quality, sustainable and affordable modern homes for New Zealanders.

"Airfields is situated in a vibrant community with a rich history and superb local amenities. The housing shortage is well acknowledged and we are pleased to have the opportunity to help meet this challenge in delivering a range of high quality housing options in this rapidly expanding and sought-after community."

The sale of Stage Two builds on the success of Stage One, which will deliver 102 standalone and terrace homes, with building scheduled to begin in the next few months.



Preparing for an interview - Part 2 of 3

Be Ready to ask questions:

The questions you ask show that you are interested in making sure the job is right for you. Here are some suggestions:

- What would I be doing and what would a typical day be like?
- Which tasks are the most important ones?
- How would I be trained or introduced to the job?
- How long should it take me to get up to speed
- How many people will I be working with, what do they do?
- Could I see where I'd be working and meet the team?
- When would you like me to start?

If the interviewer doesn't tell you things like wages, overtime, holidays and sick leave, it's okay to ask them.

We suggest you do this towards the end of the interview after you've found out all about the job and have had a chance to tell the employer how suitable you would be.

Take information with you:

Take a folder to the interview with your original CV, certificates and references (and spare copies), a copy of your application and any letters you've sent the employer – plus anything else they've sent you. Also take along your notes and questions to jog your memory, its okay to check your notes and to take notes as well.

Be ready on time:

Know the time and place of the interview and the name of the person who will be interviewing you (remember it may be more than one person).

Arrive early so that you have time to relax and feel confident. If you want to take family or Whanau along, you'll need to arrange this beforehand with the person who is interviewing you.

Make a good impression:

The impression you create in the first few minutes is very important. The employer uses your presentation to assess your attitudes, values and how you will fit in with the company. They may seem obvious but it's worth repeating some simple rules

- Take extra care with the way you look.
- Wear clean suitable clothes and shoes (no track pants, t-shirts or tight short clothes)
- Smile, shake hands firmly and look people in the
- Address people as Mr, Mrs or Ms unless they say otherwise.
- Wait to be asked to sit down be relaxed but sit
- Don't smoke, eat, use a water bottle or chew gum.
- Try not to fiddle with your hair, clothes or pens.
- Don't be critical of other companies or people

From the Kitchen....



Spice rubs

Called a 'Rub', 'Dry Rub', or 'Spice Rub' this is a mixture of spices (sometimes with herbs) that is made for the purpose of being rubbed on raw food before the food is cooked. Used mainly for preparing meats and fish. The spices are usually toasted to add flavour before being coarsely ground. In addition to the spices you can add salt or sugar – the salt for flavour and the sugar for caramelization. Dried herbs or ground spices being used can be blended in before storing or just before using.

Combinations:

Caribbean - ginger, coriander, turmeric, cocoa.

Pacific – ginger, turmeric, pepper, yellow mustard seeds, dried lemon/orange peel. Add fruit juice/soya to make a wet rub.

Jamaican – brown sugar, allspice, pepper, dill seeds, nutmeg, paprika, thyme. For wet rub use pineapple juice or rum.

The food can be marinated with the spice rub for some time (can be left in fridge overnight) for the flavours to incorporate into the food or it can be cooked immediately. This forms a coating on the food which can be left on or partially removed before cooking.

- Food can be frozen with the rub coating, providing you adhere to any food warnings that apply to safely freezing food.
- Wet or sticky rub mix dry rub with olive oil, yoghurt or butter, to make a 'sticky' rub for meat or fish.
- If leaving the skin on chicken try to get the rub underneath the skin as far as possible to get the full infusion on the meat.
- When water or stock is used in cooking process it is better to partially cook food over dry heat first to get flavours of spices through the food.
- Adding the sugar ensures caramelization as the food is cooking
- When using diced meat or small cuts, you can shake spices and food together in plastic bag to coat.

Other ingredients that can be added or substituted are: Dried chilli flakes, paprika, coffee beans, ginger, turmeric, cocoa, dried lemon peel, dried herbs – thyme, rosemary, oregano, sage.

SPICERUB

1Tbsp Coriander seeds 1Tbsp

1Tbsp Cumin seeds

1Tbsp Dill seeds 1Tbsp Fennel seeds 1Tbsp Yellow mustard seeds 2Tbsp Sugar(brown or white) ½tsp Freshly ground pepper

1Tbsp Salt

Gently toast seeds in heavy skillet, over medium heat, till brown and aromatic. Cool. Grind seeds in coffee/spice grinder. You may need to do in batches. Add sugar, salt and pepper. Can add 1 tsp red pepper flakes.

Can be stored in an airtight container for up to 6 months.



Sixty eight members were present at the first meeting of the year and we were pleased to welcome Peter Horsley, son of Zita, who was our club's foundress back in 1986. There was a noisy buzz throughout the Hall as members wasted no time in catching up with one another after the long holiday break. Called to order, the usual formalities and items of Jan Velvin and Margaret business were dealt with in straightforward fashion.

Our guest speaker was Jan Velvin, who spoke on propagation, in particular tissue culture. She has been involved with forestry work for the last ten years, prior to that with ornamentals. Most of her work is done with tweezers. She

showed us tiny specks of Redwoods and a fifteen month old sapling about two feet tall. It is a long winded process from alga and rooting and multiplying hormones then transferred to a medium in 75-90 % humidity to grow skin, which takes about ten days. After ten years the trees will be 5-6 metres tall with plans to mill them around 45 years.

Their purpose is for use in the building industry especially for shingles. Harvesting is done by cutting at the base and they will regrow with no need to replant. What I found really interesting is that this not only applies to trees but also lettuces and cabbages apparently. It was also mentioned that Sugar Delight is a great main crop Potato and extremely versatile. Jan is also involved in fostering the development of endangered species in particular the New Zealand Dotterell. Banding is done to keep track of numbers & locations.

While we grow some of our own produce, we regularly supplement our supply from Fruitworld; however a recent trip cost much more than anticipated when my husband accidentally dropped instead of pocketing his wallet. When we recovered it later, we were pleased to find all his cards still inside, and the photo of my much younger self, but it was a shock to see the cash was gone. Whoever stole about two hundred dollars from a pensioner was likely not in need but greed, and just plain mean. Nigel Latta (Mind over Money) may well have found his experiment had entirely different results if he dropped a wallet in our area.

A picnic was held at Betty's place in Massey in late February and members were asked to carpool where possible. Other reminders were to bring your own food and wear your best or favourite summer bonnet. These were judged and three prizes awarded. Guests were challenged to identify ten trees in the garden, which proved tricky; just one individual and one trio managed to correctly name them all. A gumboot throwing competition was a popular activity with a pink floral boot being tossed far and wide, and once or twice rather high. An unrushed day in lovely surroundings with good friends made for a very pleasant and successful event.




What a balmy summers night we had to visit two hidden gardens on Herald Island.

The first was Sue's quirky treasure trove of all things horsey and nautical, collected
