
I am a mum with 2 beautiful children, an understanding husband and I work full time. Just before Christmas a girlfriend decided that she was going to run the Buller ½ marathon (Westcoast South Island), and then signed me up to keep her company. The first 2 weeks of training were great and then you guessed it the wheels feel off over the festive season. Back to work I hit the road again but it


was just too hot, so I was only running 3 times a week if I was lucky (should be 5 times with my level of fitness). It was fair to say that my training plan was not going as well as I hoped so I decided that I needed an incentive to get to the finish line.

I set up a fundraising page to sponsor an event called Jump Start. Jump Start happens every year on the RNZAF airbase at Whenuapai. It is a charity event

that skydivers help raise money to sponsor a teenager from Project K or CanTeen. These children get to do a tandem jump from a C130 Hercules. Everybody involved gives their time and equipment free this includes the RNZAF and staff, tandem masters, camera flyers etc. This year that event is on the 19 and 20 of March.

Well back to race day, up at sparrows fart, throw something down then pile into a bus that drives you to the start line. The bus goes on the actual route and this is when I really started to get nervous as I had not completed the distance in training, I had only gone 16 km once with the rest of the runs being around 10km. it sure was a long way. My girlfriend also said that there was only 1 hill, well I should have known that was not the case. With sweaty hands and my heart racing I lined up at the start. Boy did I get a fright when the starting gun went off it was an actual rifle being fired, only on the West Coast! As everyone took off the most amazing thing was no one was talking and all you could hear was the sound of hundreds of feet running along and the scenery was spectacular, alas the novelty soon wore off especially when we hit the first hill, that sorted out the real athletes from the amateurs like myself. I had a man pass me going up the hill pushing a buggy. All was going great until the last 3km when the blisters got me and my toe started to throb. Then I don't know why but I started a funny grunting noise in time with my running. I passed a guy on the bridge going into town and apologised for the noise I was making and he said "don't worry you sound like one of those tennis stars", I wish. That last 3 kms was the longest run of my life and I would not have made it if it was not for the locals on the side of the road and knowing that I had raised over \$600 for my charity. 



A major fundraiser for the Tamaki Sports Academy is the free metal collection service it offers.

What's going on all around us?

It's hard to believe how much money is currently being invested in our little neck of the woods.

Whenuapai Airfield runway and taxiway upgrading is at last underway with work projected to be finished by around May 2012. Drainage settlement ponds are being built on land by Kauri Road. Waimarie Road airfield entry is the primary access point and location of the site office.

Cycleway and Pedestrian Footpath around Whenuapai Airfield (Totara and Brigham Creek Road) construction should start before winter once the final designs are completed shortly.

Kauri Road slip reconstruction is well underway and expected to be finished by May. It's quite a job as you can see and we expect some road closures to be necessary as it moves into the final construction phase.

The SH18 and SH18 Motorway development continues to push ahead. Although the signs say the opening is projected to be mid 2012, the latest official news is last quarter this year. Who knows if this great fine weather holds up, it may come even closer. The sign of tar-sealing on the road provides a false impression. This motorway is being constructed using a four-layer bitumen application and layer after layer has to be applied, rolled and compacted. Finally the last hard wearing coat will go on just before opening.

The New Sinton Road is now open and joins Brigham Creek Roundabouts right next to the Brigham Restaurant. If you want a nice drive, walk or cycle go down the new Sinton Road to the canary coloured bridge at Clarks Lane and wander over it. You will see the motorway stretching out in both directions, see the local ceramic tiles laid on the edges of the pathway and see the interesting sight of the window frames all in line for the bridge when you walk west.

Kumeu and Riverhead sewerage is coming our way as the black pipes are installed along Dale, Totara, and Brigham Creek Roads and into Trig Road where it will join up with a pipe from the new Westgate pumping station to be built shortly. The combined pipe will continue through the farm lands down to the new Whenuapai pumping station to be build shortly opposite Kauri Road. Pipes already have been laid from that site up to the new Hobsonville pumping station being built in Buckley Road at Hobsonville Point. With the pipes coming on the edge of the Whenuapai Village, one wonders when Whenuapai will also be hooked up to the sewerage system.

The Major Flood – possibly the one-in-100 year event. The storm water drainage system worked overtime draining the harbour backwards into properties from either their private drainage system of the Council drains which almost acted like fountains. The amazing contribution by residents made sure any pain suffered

by some houses was minimised and sand bags did a great job after the first tide played havoc.

Many residents expressed concern that we had announced by the loud hailers that we were asking people not to use the Causeway between 11pm and 1am on the Sunday night as we expected the next tide to cover the causeway and if a car became stuck it may block the route for emergency vehicles. In such an event the offending car would have been pushed over the side of the causeway. Our local Civil Defence team do not have the power to close any road which is why they just asked for your cooperation. It's in the interests of your safety and what they have been trained to do. Just like when they asked for you to minimise the use of the toilet system for a while when the local pumping stations were flooded. Civil Defence organised them to be pumped out very quickly and our system was quickly restored.

One last thought. That event could be the dress rehearsal for what may happen if a significant Tsunami was to hit NZ. Be prepared, look after yourself, pets and your neighbours. Our response on this occasion was amazing. It's a great place to live!





It's Heating Up in the Hall

The Whenuapai Village Hall will be a lot cosier this winter – thanks to a \$16,000 grant for heating.

The grant has been made by the Trusts Charitable Foundation to the Whenuapai R&R, so we can put in three new heat pumps in the main hall area. The money will also go towards rewiring the switchboard.

Thanks to R&R committee member Haydon Mattson for his successful efforts in securing these funds. It will certainly make our grand old hall a much more inviting place!

Our new noticeboard should be up and running outside the village dairy in Puriri Rd this month, through a grant from the old council and work done by Phillip Pratt. Please feel free to post your notices here.

We've attended our first meetings of the Upper Harbour Local Board, who meet in Albany twice a month.

It was important to clarify the wording in the draft Upper Harbour Local Board agreement, which listed among its key objectives for the next two years "Development of the Whenuapai Airport".

We were assured by the board's chairman, Brian Neeson, that the wrong wording had been used in the draft, and that the Whenuapai airbase was recognized as "a military installation only".

"Everyone on the committee to my knowledge opposes the commercialisation of Whenuapai airport. Don't lose any sleep over this," Neeson says.

The development instead refers to the change in zoning to allow development in the Whenuapai area, and to the Ministry of Defence's multi-million repair and upgrade of the airbase runway, which is now underway.

We'll being keeping a close eye on this, and making sure the board stays true to its word.

The village has been the target of a string of burglaries in the past few weeks, and some minor vandalism.

The Massey Community Constable, Aidan Crossman, has reminded us to keep an eye out for any out-of-the-ordinary behaviour, and not be afraid to report it to the police.

If it's an incident that's happening at the time, please phone 111.

But if it's not an urgent incident – like tagging – you can ring the Massey Community Police Station on 832-4099. Any information may be a piece in solving a large puzzle.

Whenuapai airfield upgrade

The Royal New Zealand Air Force Base Auckland would like to advise the local community of a likely increase in the volume of heavy vehicles on local roads around RNZAF Base Auckland during the upgrade of Whenuapai airfield.

The contractor, Fulton Hogan Auckland Ltd, will make every effort to minimise any disruption to the local community and maintain a high level of safety.

Residents within the local community may also notice an increase in the level of air traffic overhead as aircraft temporarily fly alternative circuits. These alternative circuits will be required as the secondary runway and, later on, the main runway is closed to allow the works to be undertaken.

While the contractor and the RNZAF will be making every practical effort to minimise disruption it is inevitable that works of this nature will have some impact within the local area. The Air Force regrets any inconvenience this work may cause and appreciates the support and patience of the local community during this period.

The upgrade comes after a recent announcement by the Minister of Defence that the Government will spend \$24 million as part of upgrading Whenuapai airfield at Royal New Zealand Air Force Base Auckland.

Work has begun this month and will extend over two earthworks construction seasons, with completion projected for May 2012.

The work includes an overlay and re-profiling of the main runway, upgrading of taxiways, improvements to storm water drainage and new airfield lighting.

Existing materials will be incorporated within the works including re-cycling of redundant concrete taxiways and recycling of asphalt in the new construction.

The airfield is expected to remain operational with some limitations over the course of the works.

Whenuapai is home of No.5 Squadron's P-3K Orion aircraft, No.6 Squadron's Seasprite helicopters; as well as Boeing 757 and C-130 Hercules aircraft of No.40 Squadron.

It's an exciting time for the NZ Defence Force and especially the Air Force at Whenuapai. The contract is really about having the appropriate infrastructure in place to support our fleets of operational aircraft in the provision of vital Defence outputs.

Herald Island Poets rediscovered by HI Book Club

It was Herald Island Book Club's Christmas meeting. We had (fortuitously) abandoned all efforts to do the usual "Christmas club" activities and decided upon a simple poetry recital evening. on the lawn next to the Herald Island library. A moonlit evening, candles, nibbles and an array of poetry recitals. "What a magical night" were the general comments made by most of us.

Limericks aside (we had a few) the most amazing discovery



was of two, prominent, New Zealand poets, whom had resided on Pine Island between 1949 and

Kendrick Smithyman and Mary Stanley married in 1946. moved to Pine Island (Herald Island) in 1949 with their 2 year old son Christopher, where they lived in a fibrolite bach. (Who knows which one - it will be on your title)! Kendrick was the sole teacher at the primary school on the Island between 1949 and 1951. They had another son called Stephen whilst living on the Island. In 1952 they

moved to Nile Road in Milford where another son Gerard was born in 1953.

It was in 1951 that Kendrick wrote a series of poems titled "Paihia Remembered" with 6 poems about Herald Island. This is the first of Herald Island poems.

Herald Island (1)

Know-nothing about courtesies ocean swears fealty nowhere, or respect. At this drab reach, backwater shaped of mud and shallows. ambitious dinghies quit their beach trembling on numerous hazard which follows small sea-going or large,

as consequent (you may have heard) as when one bears staggering censure for nice trivial sins.

Bear witness.

terns rise aghast, gannet dive to press obstinate down channels, by shoal and wreck scouring shores puckered below cloud. Sea scud holds land hard at its beck even here, remote from courtesies our dead move or seem to move urged by our protest lauding good conduct (Theirs? Ours? Are worthy?) worthily applauding as proper, as necessary, love. My dead misgiving principles, witness our unforgiving grieving habits wail. We do not get to prove we tenant elders, tenanted. They're of us, crowd our channels. Our eyes turn. They nod and crack! our course is headed. We thrust, accurately are thrust on wreck.

Kendrick Smithyman is now considered one of New Zealand's finest poets. His poetry was "academic" in style and he published four substantial collections as well as other writings. He died in 1995.

His wife Mary Stanley had been Dux of Thames High school was also a poet. Mary wrote her only compilation "Starveling Year" in 1953 which had some poems directly referring to life on Pine Island!

Only the garden will not be tamed.

Poetry back then was a male domain yet Mary succeeded because she persisted on acknowledging life in poetry from a women's perspective. Isolated on Pine Island between 1949 and 1952 (there was no causeway until 1958) must have been challenging for a young mother of two. She got arthritis early on and that was to cripple her and cause her considerable pain but it's not known why she never published more poetry. She has since been noted as an outstanding female poet of her time.

For those of you interested in these two outstanding New Zealand poets, there is a wealth of information available on the internet. It would be nice to obtain copies of their works and to set up a small memorial for them on the Island. Perhaps next to the library? Any suggestions?





Achilles Tendon Injuries By Craig Neale

At this time of year, evervone is motivated to exercise and shed the excesses of Christmas. Sometimes this new found motivation needs to be tempered with careful application to avoid injuries to structures such as the Achilles ten-



Characteristics of the tendon - The tendon itself is approximately the same diameter as your little finger and is designed to withstand extremely large tension loads of up to four times your body weight for short periods of time as in jumping from a height. One of the characteristics of this tissue is its low metabolic rate and poor blood supply. This enables it to withstand large repetitive loads but unfortunately also explains a very slow rate of recovery. Predisposing Injury factors:

- · Sudden, unaccustomed increase in training
- · Reduced recovery time between training
- · Poor footwear
- · Poor flexibility
- Poor biomechanics, particularly hyper-pronation
- · Stiff ankle/ foot joint mobility

Management - Early management is best as they typically do not resolve with time. Continuing exercise may interfere with the healing process. Initially ice massage can give good relief as can topical anti-inflammatory cream when acute. Identifying underlying causative factors is essential in conjunction with activity modification. Treatment will depend on stage of healing but may include soft tissue massage, acupuncture, taping techniques, orthotic prescription and a progressive strengthening regime to ensure long term recovery.

Herald Island Playgroup is growing





Cicadas and Cats

We have recently seen a number of cats off their food, with intermittent vomiting and diarrhoea. All of these cats have been observed eating cicadas and crickets.

Apparently some cats see the cicadas as little pieces of flying candy and cannot resist them as a tasty morsel. Fast food for cats! Unfortunately cicadas have a chitin exoskeleton that is indigestible, creating abdominal pain and as a result vomiting and diarrhoea ensues especially if too many are ingested at once.


However cicadas do not sting and are not toxic so do not panic. They are a good source of protein and are cooked and eaten as part of the normal diet by humans in some parts of the world. 

It always amazes me what fantastic gardens are on Herald Island. We started the year with a ramble around three gardens all completely different. Thanks to Sue and Fiona for opening up The Anchorage to us while they were away. Now where to begin this is the kind of garden I love, bits and pieces everywhere all with a nautical theme. I counted nine anchors, gave up on the oars and flags though, bits of old wharves and barges too. Apparently one of the anchors was off a submarine! There was a huge iron plate that held the cars in place

on a ferry. Lots of the bits had been retrieved from Greenhithe where they were discovered when they were digging for the new motorway. Sue and Fiona gave them a very good home. They had also taken time to photocopy the history of the ferries that served this area.

A gold fish pond full of fish and really real looking artificial water lilies. A spotty wooden dog in the front garden digging for a bone and a stone dog out back by the farm gate. Lots of mature trees with a tri-trunked rubber tree (some thought it was a Moreton Bay fig tree?). Natives trees too. This was a bird friendly garden with several bird baths and bird houses.

The next garden was a waterfront one, and the garden started on the street. When the house was built any natives removed had to be replaced, and the council checked to make sure this happened! Only 15 months old this was a garden designed and planted by our very own Matthew Edwards. Instead of the beds being covered with the usual bark Marion chose black bark which looked very dramatic and showed off the plants to their best advantage. In all Matthew planted 558 plants. One which took everyone's attention was the Ligularia with large dark, glossy green leaves that were the shape of a tractor seat! Another very attractive plant was Allamanda, a subtropical from South America. The flower is golden yellow and trumpet shaped. They like warm walls and thrive by the coast. Mathew had created a large bed down one side of the garden with an excellent colour combination. Strobilanthes had unusual silver-grey foliage which went well with a green/gold stripped Yucca called Garland's Gold. Even the lawn looked different; it had been planted with California Green ready lawn which is a very wide bladed grass. Marion loves her garden and we appreciated her letting us share her enjoyment.

Then it was off to Cindy's garden, another totally different one. A boat shaped flower bed greeted us and at first it looked like we were visiting a small cottage garden with hollyhocks and box hedging but turn a corner and there was a grassy area with trees. One tree had us all guessing. A big established tree it had most unusual tiny greeny grey triangular shaped leaves sprouting from a stalk. Somebody said it could be a wattle. This area led to flower beds then turn right and lo and behold a very large vegetable plot with built up beds. Then tucked around another corner a herb garden sheltered by a wonderful thick climbing Tecomanthe speciosa more commonly called Three Kings vine. This was another garden with a fish pond stocked with goldfish. Cindy kindly provided us with our supper and even had enough cups for all of us! Thank you Cindy and Geoff.


