Fight to keep path project alive

We have a fight on our hands.

The \$1.9 million footpath and cycleway project we fought so hard to get underway, which should have gone into construction this month, has hit a major road block.

The funding secured through the Waitakere City Council late last year has now been redirected to a "large pool of funding" in the new Auckland Transport coffers, during the transition to the Super City.

So now we have to convince the new council to reassign the money to this crucial project which will address the real safety issue for pedestrians and cyclists on both Brigham Creek and Totara Roads.

The Whenuapai R&R has now made a submission to the Auckland Council, with the objective of having the Whenuapai footpaths and cycleway project reconfirmed, funded and constructed in the 2011/12 Annual Plan.

We are all so disappointed - after 10 years of campaigning for a pathway along Totara Rd, followed by six months of consultation and planning work with the Waitakere City Council, and being assured that the \$1.9 million project would be carried out and the footpath/cycleway constructed in the last quarter of 2010/2011. So we have implored the Auckland Council to continue to carry out this crucial project in the interests of our community's safety, first and foremost.

As we know, Brigham Creek Rd and Totara Rd are regularly used by cyclists and pedestrians, from runners and dog walkers, horses and riders, and farmers on tractors, to school children and mothers with pushchairs. They are also areas notorious for accidents – be they pedestrian versus motor vehicle, or bicycle versus motor vehicle. There have also been many incidents of road rage involving cyclists and

runners.

Neither road has adequate footpaths or off-road tracks, and there are minimal grass verges, creating a hazardous situation. The speed limit for the majority of Totara Rd is 80kmph.

Local residents run, cycle and walk on these roads every day – taking their lives into their own hands as they do so. Staff from the air base use these routes daily for their fitness exercises, and are forced to run on the road against the run of traffic. Some have been injured in accidents in recent years.

Many of the airbase staff also cycle to work along these roads. A dual footpath/cycleway on Brigham Creek Rd – from the intersection with Kauri Rd through to the Airbase gates – would give them a much safer passage. People from outside the area regularly use these stretches of roads to cycle, walk and run too.

The paths will also allow school children to walk or ride their bikes to Whenuapai School. As a community, we wish to encourage our children to do this.

There are some good signs that this project will still go ahead. The detailed design of the paths, successfully tendered by Blue Barn, is almost complete. We have been assured by the Upper Harbour Local Board that it has reconfirmed its support of this "very worthwhile project" through the current Annual Plan process. We are heartened by this support.

We've put a great deal of work and effort in getting this project off the ground, to get what's best for our community. We can only trust the Council will recognise how vital it is for this project to continue, and the footpaths start taking shape on our landscape within the next year.



Audrey Jackman

It is with great sadness that we report the passing of Audrey Jackman, one of Whenuapai's long-term residents, on Sunday 27h March.

Born in Mosgiel, Audrey's early career as a cook introduced her to her life long passion for flying. She worked as chief cook at Tairei RNZAF station then later moving on to Ohakea and finally RNZAF Whenuapai in the early 60's. Audrey was one of the first members of the Aviation Sports Club at the base and after learning to fly and gaining her Private Pilots Licence she discovered the joys of parachuting. At age 39 she made her first jump which fired a passion she kept for the rest of her life.

After many years travelling in Europe, Middle East, Russia and the USA Audrey returned to Whenuapai and became a jumpmaster/instructor introducing many people to parachuting. One of Audrey's most memorable experiences was being invited to take part in the 60th Anniversary of the Allied Landing at Normandy in 2004 as an assistant jumpmaster on a DC3. Parachuting gave Audrey a purpose for living and helped here achieve here life long ambition of world travel.

Hobsonville motorway six months ahead of schedule

The Hobsonville motorway projects (the SH18 Hobsonville Deviation and the SH16 Brigham Creek motorway extension) are on track to be finished and open for use in September - six months ahead of schedule.

Transport Minister Steven Joyce says the government's billion dollar boost to state highway funding over three years has provided a secure funding pipeline which has given contractors the confidence to continue investing in people and machinery and complete projects more quickly.

The Hobsonville motorway projects are part of the Western Ring Route - a 48 kilometre alternative to SH1 running between Manukau and Albany via State Highways 20, 16 and 18.

Mr Joyce says when complete, the \$220 million project will, significantly reduce congestion in North-west Auckland and improve journey times between the West and the North Shore.

"The new road will also greatly improve road safety in the area by taking through traffic off the local roading network. The NZTA expects traffic on Hobsonville Road to reduce from 40,000 vehicles per day currently to 6,500 per day."

"The news that the project is on track to be complete ahead of the Rugby World Cup is an added bonus."

NZTA is currently seeking planning permission and resource consents from a Board of Inquiry to complete the largest remaining piece of the Western Ring Route - the Waterview Connection and associated improvements to the Northwestern Motorway.





In reply, the seasoned home team set a cracking pace at the batting crease, but Whenuapai's incisive fielding restricted the Islanders to 50.


After days of rain that threatened to scupper the match yet again, the clouds parted long enough for a great Neighbour's Day gathering.

This was just one of the comments made by our Massey Police at the recent Neighbourhood Support meeting. There were almost 70 residents and members of Neighbourhood Support from Whenuapai and Herald Island who made the meeting that night. The Senior Sergeant was impressed with our turnout, and said that this is actually an area of low crime because of the Community's true efforts to be vigilant and to notify them immediately when an incident occurs. We thank you all for taking the time to attend, and hopefully you found it useful.

Any burglary or theft however is one too many for us, so what should we be doing to protect our property?

Neighbour awareness is paramount as most burglaries occur during the day, locking up even when home, alarms, dogs, communication about 'odd' events - they all help. And if you see someone wandering around on a neighbour's property, maybe even wearing a fluro jacket, one can always politely ask if they need help, or do they have an ID card. But remember they probably ARE genuine!

If there is suspicious activity in progress, PLEASE ring 111 straightaway, or *555 for traffic incidents. Police usually arrive pretty quickly if there is a chance of catching the thief!

If an incident has occurred, and time has elapsed, it is still important to notify the Police (Henderson or Massey) and get the appropriate forms filled in, high incident areas get priority. Also let your Street Co-ordinator know so we can warn others!

Important keep safe earthquake information – worth the read

Some of this information is directly opposite of what we've been taught over the years. I can remember in school being told to "duck and cover" or stand in a doorway during an earthquake. This guy's findings are amazing. I hope we all remember his survival method if we are ever in an earthquake

Extract from Doug Copp's article on the "Triangle of Life"

My name is Doug Copp. I am the Rescue Chief and Disaster Manager of the American Rescue Team International (ARTI), the world's most experienced rescue team. The information in this article will save lives in an earthquake.

I have crawled inside 875 collapsed buildings, worked with rescue teams from 60 countries, founded rescue teams in several countries, and I am a member of many rescue teams from many countries...

I was the United Nations expert in Disaster Mitigation for two years. I have worked at every major disaster in the world since 1985, except for simultaneous disasters.

The first building I ever crawled inside of was a school in Mexico City during the 1985 earthquake. Every child was under its desk. Every child was crushed to the thickness of their bones. They could have survived by lying down next to their desks in the aisles. It was obscene, unnecessary and I wondered why the children were not in the aisles. I didn't at the time know that the children were told to hide under something.

Simply stated, when buildings collapse, the weight of the ceilings falling upon the objects or furniture inside crushes these objects, leaving a space or void next to them. This space is what I call the "triangle of life".

The larger the object, the stronger, the less it will compact. The less the object compacts, the larger the void, the greater the probability that the person who is using this void for safety will not be injured. The next time you watch collapsed buildings, on television, count the "triangles" you see formed. They are everywhere. It is the most common shape, you will see, in a collapsed building.

Tips for earthquake safety:

- Most everyone who simply "ducks and covers" when buildings collapse are crushed to death. People who get under objects, like desks or cars, are crushed.
- 2) Cats, dogs and babies often naturally curl up in the fetal position. You should too in an earthquake... it is a natural safety/survival instinct. You can survive in a smaller void. Get next to an object, next to a sofa, next to a large bulky object that will compress slightly but leave a void next to it.
- 3) Wooden buildings are the safest type of construction to be in during an earthquake. Wood is flexible and moves with the force of the earthquake. If the wooden building does collapse, large survival voids are created. Also, the wooden building has less concentrated, crushing weight. Brick buildings will break into individual bricks. Bricks will cause many injuries but less squashed bodies than concrete slabs.
- 4) If you are in bed during the night and an earthquake occurs, simply roll off the bed. A safe void will exist around the bed. Hotels can achieve a much greater survival rate in earthquakes, simply by posting a sign on The back of the door of every room telling occupants to lie down on the floor, next to the bottom of the bed during an earthquake.
- 5) If an earthquake happens and you cannot easily escape by getting out the door or window, then lie down and curl up in the fetal position next to a sofa, or large chair.
- Most everyone who gets under a doorway when buildingscollapse is killed. How? If you stand under a doorway

and the doorjamb falls forward or backward you will be crushed by the ceiling above. If the door jam falls sideways you will be cut in half by the doorway. In either case, you will be killed!

- 7) Never go to the stairs. The stairs have a different "moment of frequency" (they swing separately from the main part of the building). The stairs and remainder of the building continuously bump into each other until structural failure of the stairs takes place. The people who get on stairs before they fail are chopped up by the stair treads - horribly mutilated. Even if the building doesn't collapse, stay away from the stairs. The stairs are a likely part of the building to be damaged. Even if the stairs are not collapsed by the earthquake, they may collapse later when overloaded by fleeing people. They should always be checked for safety, even when the rest of the building is not damaged.
- Get Near the Outer Walls Of Buildings Or Outside Of Them If Possible - It is much better to be near the outside of the building rather than the interior. The farther inside you are from the outside perimeter of the building the greater the probability that your escape route will be blocked.
- People inside of their vehicles are crushed when the road above falls in an earthquake and crushes their vehicles; which is exactly what happened with the slabs between the decks of the Nimitz Freeway... The victims of the San Francisco earthquake all staved inside of their vehicles. They were all killed. They could have easily survived by getting out and sitting or lying next to their vehicles. Everyone killed would have survived if they had been able to get out of their cars and sit or lie next to them. All the crushed cars had voids 3 feet high next to them, except for the cars that had columns fall directly across them.
- 10) I discovered, while crawling inside of collapsed newspaper offices and other offices with a lot of paper, that paper does not compact. Large voids are found surrounding stacks

Spread the word and save someone's life.... The Entire world is experiencing natural calamities so be prepared! "We are but angels with one wing, it takes two to fly".

In 1996 we made a film, which proved my survival methodology to be correct. The Turkish Federal Government, City of Istanbul, University of Istanbul Case Productions and ARTI co-operated to film this practical, scientific test. We collapsed a school and a home with 20 mannequins inside. Ten mannequins did "duck and cover," and ten mannequins I used in my "triangle of life" survival method. After the simulated earthquake collapse we crawled through the rubble and entered the building to film and document the results. The film, in which I practiced my survival techniques under directly observable, scientific conditions, relevant to building collapse, showed there would have been zero percent survival for those doing duck and cover. There would likely have been 100 percent survivability for people using my method of the "triangle of life." This film has been seen by millions of viewers on television in Turkey and the rest of Europe, and it was seen in the USA, Canada and Latin America on the TV program Real TV.



The number of house sales in Auckland continued its bounce back from January's slump with new listings returning to more normal levels through February and March. 



All the fun of a fair






