Surrounding areas comment

Construction has begun on Westgate's community centre and library with a completion date likely to be late 2018. Auckland Council's community facilities manager, Rod Sheridan, says it is expected to be open to the public by early 2019.

"It is designed as a meeting point where the community can access a range of resources and activities, and actively participate in community life."

The building is located on Kohuhu Lane and will have a floor area of around 3600 square metres. It has been reported that the cost is likely to be close to \$27 million. The complex will include Citizen Advice Bureau offices and, public toilets.

In other Westgate news, the area around Westgate/Redhills is set to have over 10,000 homes built over the next 10 years, according to a NZ Herald report.



Fun for little ones at Big Teddy Fridays

Homemade herbal hand

cream

1 and 1/2 cups Olive Oil 1/2 cup Bees Wax (when melted) 1/2 cup Coconut Oil 1 tsp Honey

1 tsp Castor Oil (optional, but helps to draw out toxins from the skin)

Handful of dry herbs (Calendula, Rose Petals or Lavender)

Everything needs to be dry before you start (containers, spoons, herbs etc).

In your largest jar put the olive oil and herbs. Save a few perfect looking herbs for decorating the finished lotion. Place the jar in a pot and fill the pot with warm water so that it is just about the same level as the oil, maybe a bit higher. This makes a poor mans double boiler. Place the pot on medium heat.

In the smaller jar, place some chopped up beeswax and place this jar in the water next to the oil and herb jar. When the beeswax is melted, you can turn down the heat and start straining the herbs from the oil. If you don't get them all out right away, don't worry; you can strain it again when you fill the pots.

Combine about 1/2 cup of coconut oil to the olive oil. Feel free to bring up the heat again at this point. When the coconut oil is completely melted, CAREFULLY poor about 1/2 cup of melted beeswax into the oil. Mix it all together and test the consistency by dripping a few drops onto a tin, letting it cool, and feeling how creamy it is.

Make certain you have the honey and castor oil ready.

Remove the jar from the water, and very quickly add honey and castor oil to the lotion, sir very well. Pour through a strainer into the jars.

Leave it somewhere with the lid off where it won't be disturbed until it starts to go creamy and the top just starts to solidify.

Place the remaining herbs on top of the lotion, and press gently with your finger.

Infusing the herbs into the oil like this gives a very mild scent but also helps impart some of the healing qualities in the herbs into your hand cream.

You can add essential oils to the cream at the same time as the castor oil, but I don't recommend it. Essential oils can be as harmful as they are helpful, and if you are making this for someone with skin troubles, it is best to keep things as gentle as possible.

This hand cream is NOT vegan friendly due to the beeswax and honey, but it is suitable for most vegetarians and will work well for most people with allergies. If you are giving it away, make sure you include an ingredients list.



Treasure Islands joint initiative programme



'Treasure Islands' campaign is a joint initiative between DOC and Auckland Council to help protect conservation islands in the Hauraki

There's plenty to love about Auckland's awesome gulf island treasures, from sea birds to tuatara and takahc. Many of these islands

have received substantial investment in recent decades both in hard cash and volunteer hours to become pest free. The Treasure Island's campaign ensures we all play our part to guard these special places and at Herald Island we are committing to the initiative.

Herald Island Environmental Group has teamed up with Herald Island Boating Club to raise the profile of the Treasure Island campaign among boaties that use the boat ramp and Herald Island wharves. Three new Protecta rat stations have been placed at the wharves and these are being monitored weekly by boat club member Craig Carr.

Auckland Council Biosecurity has recently revived the campaign and Herald Island has been the first to receive and install new signage.

Anyone visiting the pest free Hauraki Gulf Islands can do their bit to make sure they remain pest free by following these basic guidelines:

- Check your gear for pests, e.g. rodents, insects, skinks
- Clean footwear and gear, removing soil and seeds
- Seal ensure your gear is zipped up (no open bags)

How common is Whooping Cough

There have been cases of Whooping Cough reported recently in the news, basic information below:

Whooping Cough can be very serious for babies and children – especially those under 1 year old. If babies catch whooping cough, they:

- May not be able to feed or breathe properly.
- May become so ill they need to go to hospital.
- Could end up with serious complications such as pneumonia and brain damage.

To protect your baby, get your free immunisation between 28-38 weeks of pregnancy and take your baby for their free immunisations when they're 6 weeks, 3 months and 5 months old.

People with whooping cough are infectious from 6 days after exposure to the bacteria, when symptoms are like a normal cold, to 3 weeks after the 'whooping' cough begins – unless they are treated with antibiotics.

Many babies catch whooping cough from their older siblings or parents – often before they're old enough to be vaccinated.

Most cases of whooping cough occur in adults whose immunity has faded. In these cases, symptoms tend to be less serious, although the persistent cough can be unpleasant and frustrating.

Update on Mumps outbreak in Auckland

Auckland is experiencing an unprecedented mumps outbreak. There have been over 370 cases with more than 60 schools affected this year. Schools have had to exclude students and staff with mumps and any close contacts who haven't been fully immunised with the measles-mumps-rubella (MMR) vaccine.

This has disrupted the school, the students' learning and parents who have had to take time off work. Mumps can have serious complications requiring hospitalisation.

With exam and assessment time coming up in secondary schools, please suggest parents check their children have had two doses of the MMR vaccine. This will also protect students from the contagious measles and rubella viruses as well.



Details were announced about forthcoming events, including the Memorial Service for Tom, the late husband of Maureen Campbell-White, on 8th October, the Matakana trip later in September, the Riverhead/Taupaki one in October, the trip away

to Gisborne in November and the Christmas function to be held at the Huapai Golf Club early in December.

Yates used to be a family business and the present smaller Company is a public entity under the Dulux group. Those at Yates believe Gardening is good for the soul. To that end they support National Gardening Week, which runs 6-13 October, being held for just the second time this year, also School Gardening as an important initiative to get young gardeners enthused and motivated to produce their own food.

With advances in knowledge of long term effects of some products previously endorsed, here's what we were told of what's out and what's available instead. Shield has been replaced by Rose Gun Advanced, Soil Insect Killer by Complete Lawn Insect Control, Bravo by Yates Liquid Copper and Target by Confidor. When spraying, do it early or late in the day, read instructions first, wear gloves, eyewear and dust mask when mixing and spraying. Mavrik is recommended for control of caterpillars. aphids and mites while seaweed tonic is ideal for stressed plants and to give seedlings a boost before planting out.

There are fourteen new varieties of seeds available as well as all the old favourites. Yates have a website and a free Garden Club.

Very soon now it will be time for the Annual General Meeting in November when seven members will stand down from Committee so it would be great to have some fresh input into the smooth running of our group. Volunteers are needed or you may nominate others who may be keen to help.



Herald Island Library News




Roll on summer!.
