Turn on the lights, and learn how to save a life

Lights, defibrillator, lolly scramble action! There's a lot to celebrate in Whenuapai Village to round out 2017, on Friday evening, December 1.

First, we will have our new defibrillator, which will be available for everyone in the village and surrounding area to use in an emergency.

The Whenuapai R&R has purchased the AED (automated external defibrillator) with the help of a grant from the Trusts Community Foundation. It's a vital piece of equipment in a community like ours. Each year more than 2000 New Zealanders suffer a cardiac arrest outside of hospital. Using an AED within 3-5 minutes of collapse can help increase the chance of survival by up to 40 percent.

The AED will be located inside the village hall. When people in our area call the St John Ambulance after someone has suffered a cardiac arrest, they will be given instructions on how to access the equipment. St John will be giving a free 15-minute demonstration on how to use the defibrillator in the Whenuapai Village Hall on December 1, at 7pm.

It coincides with our annual switching on of the Christmas Lights at the hall, which will take place on dusk.

We will also be having a lolly scramble for the kids and Christmas mince pies for the adults. So bring a drink, friends and family to the village hall from 7pm, and celebrate our great little village community.

Christmas Beach is part of Auckland Council's new Safeswim initiative



With the rising concern from individuals, communities and those in governing positions around the quality of our waters, changes in transparency are happening. One such initiative is being launched this November – the new Safeswim programme.

Safeswim is a year round monitoring and forecasting programme to give Aucklanders information about the water quality of their beaches as well as up to date information on additional risks like tides, wind and other health hazards like jellyfish. It delivers transparent and real time data that is more accurate than the previous retrospective reporting previously used.

The purpose of Safeswim is to inform beach users about water quality and other aspects of beach safety so that locals and visitors are aware of the quality of the water at a given time. Currently, there are times when Christmas Beach is not safe for swimming. Christmas Beach will have a new sign installed to direct beach users to the WebApp (safeswim.org.nz). There, they will be taken to a predictive model for Christmas Beach that meets international performance standards. Over time, monitoring of this model will be undertaken to validate and refine the forecasts.

The more Council knows about the quality of the water the more they can do to mitigate and ultimately regenerate our waterways. To help this, Healthy Waters (Auckland Council) are undertaking ongoing investigations into the water quality at Christmas Beach. The intention of these investigations is to identify sources of pollution and rectify them.

In conjunction with the growing intensification happening around us, we need to acknowledge Auckland Council's willingness to address the impacts of wastewater and stormwater flowing into streams and beaches whenever it rains. Another Council initiative soon to be announced is the Healthy Waters programme, to which the Herald Island Environmental Group is now an acknowledged stakeholder. Over the next few years, we will be involved in working with Council and other stakeholders with the goal to deliver 21st century standards around our waters.

To be effective, this can't bean 'us and them'scenario. As residents, we also have a role in cleaning up our waterways – and we all need to actively take responsibility for what enters the waterways. 





Bring back the birds project



A group of interested locals attended the bird count workshop on Saturday 14th October. Abi Hill, a second year ecology student discussed objectives for the Herald Island 5min bird count. Basically it's a monthly project that will build up a picture of birds in several areas of Herald Island. The more people who participate the more areas we'll be able to cover.

Coordinator, Jilleen Lockie, will collect monthly information from people interested in participating in the project. If you weren't able to make it to the workshop contact Jilleen for a form and information sheet to get started.

Abi told us to pick an area on our property with good visibility in all directions and quietly stand and using the form supplied, note birds and bird sounds for 5 minutes. We watch and listen standing in the middle of a 20 metre radius (around and above you). We were advised to avoid the 'morning chorus' and the late afternoon/evening when the birds are settling in for the night.

The group decided to all do our 5 minute survey on first week of each month, for 1 year. It's a commitment, but as one of the guys in the group piped up and said, "it's only 1 hour over the whole year".

It will be fun, I'm sure we'll brush up on our bird knowledge and their 'tweeting' sounds. Actually we've been giving a website where we can identify birds and their sound which could be very useful for a start.

Housing and home loan news for November 2017

- House price inflation has slowed nationally and prices were generally flat in September in the biggest cities. Prices in Auckland and Christchurch were down 3 per cent and 1 per cent respectively from a year ago. Wellington's annual inflation rate was 10 per cent in September and Napier's was 18, while Hamilton was flat and Tauranga was up 6%.
- The Reserve Bank has forecast an unchanged Official Cash Rate through all of 2017 and all of 2018. It does not see the first hike until late 2019.
- Banks have stopped lifting longer term mortgage rates and now also see the OCR on hold until late 2018 after weak inflation and growth figures. Some are tentatively lowering some special mortgage rates and advertising more after the gaps between their lending growth and deposit growth rates narrowed to
- The Reserve Bank is unlikely to be able to introduce a debt to income limit in 2017. It has to do lengthy consultation and it has said it would not use the tool right now even if it had it because of the market's moderation.

MORTGAGE BORROWING STRATEGY

With average mortgage rates barely moving in the past month, our favoured views have not shifted at all. From a "lowest is best" perspective, the 1-year rate still stands out. And this is consistent with our expectation of the OCR being on hold for an extended period. Longer-term rates remain very low by historic standards and offer certainty. Some borrowers may wish to spread risk by

borrowing over a number of fixed terms. The



downside is that we struggle to see where inflation is going to come from to necessitate major lifts in the OCR.







If you happened to have called in to the Library on the 31st October it was well adorned by our local queen of ceremonies Sue McElroy and her daughter Kadeea and helper Bea Green.

The Herald Island Halloween event is an annual tradition well patronised and thoroughly enjoyed by all!

Thank you to all who contributed and participated in making 2017 Halloween night a special one!

The Library this month takes a wee peek at an Italian place named Barga (no not bugger), "The most Scottish town in Italy," after the hills and reminiscence of Scotland (additionally, there are



many red telephone booths lying around Barga's streets.) A photo of one which was taken by two of our well-travelled locals Murray & Raewyn Brown noting it "a British telephone box next to Kennedy Park in Barga, in a small hill town near Lucca in Tuscany". Not dissimilar to our excellent one next to the Library on Herald Island .Barga is a quaint town of centuries-old traditions, dating to the Longobard era in the early middle Ages (6th-8th centuries), Barga lies in a striking location between the slopes of the Tuscan-Emilian Apennines and the majestic Apuan Alps. The population in 2010 was approximately 10.5k and growing .The kaleidoscope of colours, mild climate, myriad artworks and the warm welcome of the people add to the sheer beauty of the Barga Mountains.

Barga is dominated by its castle, which is perched on a rocky spur displaying the traditional structure of the medieval town protected by walls and only accessible through three gates: Porta Reale, Porta Macchiaia and Porta di Borgo. Walking through the narrow streets and tiny piazzas that withstood the test of time, you realize just how haphazard the old edifices are, lodged within a spider's web of walkways. Take via Del Pretorio and narrow streets and cart tracks open up left and right, proof of medieval buildings and unusual views as far as piazza Ser Barghesano, when the beautiful facade of the Duomo di San Cristoforo Cathedral appears before you.Barga adds to its rich cultural life of summer jazz and opera festivals, regular international contemporary

art exhibitions, outdoor markets, and a gem like theatre founded in 1688, in addition to a city life that is vibrant, diverse and will take any excuse to celebrate. Whether it is the Porcini mushroom season or the chestnut harvest, there is always something there to keep you amused.

Bagna is honoured and is named as one of 50 Most Beautiful Villages in Italy and noted as one of the best distinguished Tourist Destinations and home to a sophisticated blend of town and Country. This medieval city is set in the beautiful mountainous northwest corner of Tuscany and situated on a spur overlooking the mid-Serchio River Valley. The place is spectacular for it lovely tree lined roads with Florentine Villas and its still evident today in its pride of their great love of their culture, art, language and architecture. This place is well known for its superb food, pecorino cheeses, wild boar, vast chestnut forests, and wine but more so

for its Grappa liqueur line with several versions of the traditional aperitifs including their mandarin liqueur which is served in winter with a twist .It's also famous for its delicious rum called "Leone 70" which is the company that produces it, goes back over 100 years and yes its alcohol content is 70% proof. Fortunately, Leone 70 is used judiciously, a nice warm kick to coffee, on a cold morning or evening and I suppose which may account for the warm friendly temperaments around and wonderful atmosphere. It is a real shame that I didn't get the Browns to throw one in their bag home for a good tasting or two. Hopefully one day we will too enjoy the roads like this most travelled. Passchendaele remembered 'New Zealand's Darkest Day'

Five thousand New Zealanders were killed in Flanders during the First World War and there are more New Zealanders buried in Belgian soil than in any other country outside New Zealand.

Two thousand, four hundred and twelve New Zealanders died in the Passchendaele Offensive from 31st July to 10th November 1917. At the Battle of Passchendaele on 12th October 1917, eight hundred and forty six New Zealanders were killed in

action. It was New Zealand's darkest day.

This symbolic field of 2412 personalised White Crosses that were installed in the field in front of the Auckland War Memorial Museum commemorated all those men.

"In Flanders fields the poppies blow – between the crosses, row on row." Fields of remembrance service and sacrifice.

We attended the Passchendaele commemoration service, at the Auckland War Memorial Museum along with many others on October 12, 2017. The symbolic crosses were sobering. Amoung the masses we found one of our own, Lance Corporal Wyman Coutts, 10th NZ Reinforcements, who died of wounds in France on October 17, 1917 aged 22 years. Wyman was Kadeeas great, great uncle.


The small design business are very well known for their wrap dress collection, but also specialise in designer corporate wear, stylish uniforms, mother of the bride and casual daywear. You can

There were 57 members present at the Whenuapai Community Hall in Waimarie Road for our October Meeting when a member of our group, Mary King, was our speaker for the day. Her topic was her passionate interest and she shared her love for irises. The history of the Iris is rich, dating back to Ancient Greek times when the Greek Goddess, Iris, the messenger of the gods and the personification of the rainbow, acted as the link between heaven and earth. From the earliest days irises were used to make perfume and as a medicinal remedy.

Mary is a member of the New Zealand Iris Society, which was formed in November 1950, and its objectives are to encourage, improve and extend the study and cultivation of the Genus Iris and to collaborate with Iris Societies in other countries to regulate the nomenclature, classification and registration of irises. There are many Irises, some bearded, some not. The shadings and markings on the flowers are designed to point the way for the bees which pollinate them.

We learned that Irises flower almost throughout the year since with different varieties blooming at different times there are flowers for nearly every season. The Evansias or crested Iris bloom in Spring and are named for Thomas Evans who introduced them to England in 1794. The Roof Iris from Japan is so called because it is actually grown in the thatch on the roof in it's native China, binding the medium of thatch and clay together, therefore not taking up space in the ground so valuable for growing edible crops. The root of the roof iris is ground up and used in face powder.

Some Irises are even grown in water. They like their feet in water but not to be flooded. This type is from the Louisana family. Then in summer the Siberian hybrid flowers. It has flowers that resemble exotic butterflies. Mary had pictures of many varieties to show on the big screen which were an absolute delight. Most Irises hate lime and prefer acidic soil in which to grow. Whatever your preference it seems there are many different types of Irises, each more colourful and attractive than the last.

We were warned about African Club Moss which is a PEST. African Club Moss (Selaginella kraussiana) forms extensive mats on damp forest floor. Dispersing quickly, it grows on tree trunks and tolerates a wide range of conditions, including hot, cold and deep shade, although it does need wet ground. Originally from southern Africa, it was first noticed in the wild in New Zealand in 1919. It can form part of a cycle which leads to weed invasion of bush – because it tolerates shady forest floors it smothers native seedlings, opening up the area to other weeds such as vines.
