



Rescue off the Island



Two kayakers stuck in the mud in Waitemata Harbour - one up to his waist. The pair were rescued by the Westpac helicopter which winched them to safety. The couple raised the alarm about 1.40pm, on February 10th when they got stuck in the mud as they were caught in the retreating tide. Police, the Fire Service and Auckland Westpac Rescue Helicopter were all dispatched to the scene near where the kayakers were stuck - on the Causeway, about 200m off Herald Island. No injuries were sustained, but as the tide had gone out, they couldn't get back to land on their own.



In loving memory of Kaye Lorraine Trubuhovich14 November 1944 - 17 January 2016She passed away peacefully at her home after a long illness, surrounded her girls, Tanya, Natalie and Lisa, and her roses. Kaye was a Village girl, a daughter of Raymond Arthur and Myra Margaret Milne who lived in Waimarie Road. There were seven children in the family: Raymond, Kaye, Alan, Ian, Stuart, Ross and Joanna. Ray senior joined the Air force in1948 and the family made Whenuapai Village their home for around forty years from



1960. When Kaye was married in 1966, the celebration was held in the Village Hall. She loved dancing and threw herself wholeheartedly into all her endeavours, none more so than raising her daughters by being involved in all their sporting activities. Kaye was a busy, social, creative, imaginative person who at various times ran a fruit shop, a wool shop, the Herb Patch, had a stand at Craft World, loved Gardening and was President of Whenuapai Floral and Garden Circle. She organised trips and latterly enjoyed touring the world. Her husband Michael George, known as Mike, died in March 2009. They were a devoted couple. A celebration of Kaye's life was held at the Morrison Funeral Home in Henderson on Thursday, 21 January, Her bright presence and cheerful personality will be missed. (Some information supplied by Kaye's sister, Joanna, whose boys have grown into fine young men; Daniel is a lawyer and Joshua a schoolteacher. His grandmother, Myra Milne, used to bring him to the Village Playgroup and was the first grandmother to attend on a regular basis. Myra died in 2011.)

Autumn has arrived according to the calendar, but not always to the weather. The dryness and humidity has caused some problems, but not to the WEEDS.

Wet newspaper layers, or even damp cardboard overlapping in worst areas and covered with mulch works really well. For

Watch out for mildew which usually attacks early autumn. Hydrangeas, roses, sweet peas and some vegetables are severely affected by the disease. Placing compost on the garden and blood and bone, or general purpose fertiliser on is a good way to feed, and help your plants grow quickly before the colder weather slows them down. For heavy soil, add some dolomite or lime.

Lift your summer flowering bulbs as they die down, and plant your spring flowering bulbs.

Aphid and Black spot spray. To 1 litre water add 1Tbsp baking soda,, 1Tbsp oil 1Tbsp vinegar. Place in a spray bottle. Shake before each use.

This summer has been difficult for gardeners, but no one would have known, when we visited Jan's garden on Herald Island in February. She had a restful front yard under the shelter of a couple of large trees. This is where the vireya and ligularia all thrived. To the side of the house the vegetable garden flourished, still full of beans and tomatoes and buzzing with bees from her beehive. The rear of the property sloped down to the bank, which has been a major project recently. Jan has been a pivotal member of "Keep Herald Island Beautiful Group" (now part of the "Herald Island Environmental Group") over many years and has been instrumental in gathering seed and growing indigenous native species that she has found on the island, particularly on the coastline. She has eradicated all the noxious weeds on her coastal bank and planted out the seedlings she has carefully nurtured. Closer to the house, she had a beautiful show of hydrangeas in full bloom and some astelia gathered and grown from local seed. Then in another shady spot at the side she was growing herbs and green vegetables. Thank you for hosting us Jan, it was great to see one of our Garden Club's inaugural members still going strong.
